WHEREAS, the Township of North Bergen (the "Local Unit"), in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, has determined that there exists a need within the Local Unit to provide for sewer improvements on 85th Street, consisting of the replacement and enlargement of the 15" diameter storm sewer line on 85th Street, between 2nd Avenue and JFK Boulevard, to increase the hydraulic capacity of the drainage line conveying stormwater away from the intersection of 85th Street and 2nd Avenue and the replacement of the sanitary sewer line, including all work and materials necessary therefor and incidental thereto (the "Project"), and it is the desire of the Local Unit to obtain financing for such Project through participation in the New Jersey Water Bank of the New Jersey Infrastructure Bank (the "I-Bank");

Section 2. - (d) the purchase price for the Note shall be par;
- (e) the Note shall be subject to prepayment prior to its stated maturity in accordance with the terms and conditions of the Note;
- (f) the Note shall be issued in a single denomination and shall be numbered "CFP- 2023-1" or such other denomination as may be requested by the I-Bank;
- (g) the Note shall be issued in fully registered form and shall be payable to the registered owner thereof as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America; and
- (h) the Note shall be executed by the manual or facsimile signatures of the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer under official seal or facsimile thereof affixed, printed, engraved or reproduced thereon and attested by the manual signature of the Local Unit Clerk.

Section 5. The Note shall be substantially in the form required by the I-Bank, together with such additions, deletions and other modifications required by the I-Bank and agreed to by the Local Unit upon consultation with counsel and any advisors to the Local Unit, such determinations being conclusively evidenced by the execution of the Note by the Mayor and the Chief Financial Officer (collectively, the "Authorized Officers").

Section 6. The law firm of McManimon, Scotland & Baumann, LLC is hereby authorized to arrange for the printing of the Note, which law firm may authorize McCarter & English, LLP, bond counsel to the I-Bank for the Construction Financing Loan Program, to arrange for same.

Section 7. The Authorized Officers of the Local Unit are hereby further severally authorized to (i) execute and deliver, and the Local Unit Clerk is hereby further authorized to attest to such execution and to affix the corporate seal of the Local Unit to, any document, instrument or closing certificate deemed necessary, desirable or convenient by the Authorized Officers or the

Secretary of the Local Unit, as applicable, in their respective sole discretion, after consultation with counsel and any advisors to the Local Unit and after further consultation with the I-Bank and its representatives, agents, counsel and advisors, to be executed in connection the issuance and sale of the Note and the participation of the Local Unit in the Construction Financing Loan Program, which determination shall be conclusively evidenced by the execution of each such certificate or other document by the party authorized hereunder to execute such certificate or other document, and (ii) perform such other actions as the Authorized Officers deem necessary, desirable or convenient in relation to the execution and delivery of the Note and the participation of the Local Unit in the Construction Financing Loan Program.

BOND ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE ACQUISITION OF REAL PROPERTY, THE MAKING OF VARIOUS PUBLIC IMPROVEMENTS AND THE ACQUISITION OF ADDITIONAL AND REPLACEMENT EQUIPMENT IN AND FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, TO APPROPRIATE THE SUM OF \$8,560,000 TO PAY THE COST THEREOF, TO MAKE A DOWN PAYMENT, TO AUTHORIZE THE ISSUANCE OF BONDS TO FINANCE SUCH APPROPRIATION IN THE AMOUNT OF \$8,132,000 AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE ISSUANCE OF BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES IN ANTICIPATION OF THE ISSUANCE OF SUCH BONDS

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, in the County of Hudson, State of New Jersey, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. The acquisition of land, the making of the public improvements and the acquisition of the additional and replacement equipment described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance are hereby authorized to be acquired and made by the Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, State of New Jersey (the "Township"). There is appropriated to the acquisition of land, the acquisition of additional and replacement equipment and the making of the improvements described in Section 3 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes") the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriations for said respective purposes. Such appropriations shall be financed from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized herein and the down payment authorized and appropriated by this bond ordinance.

Section 2. The Board of Commissioners of the Township has ascertained and hereby determines that (1) none of the purposes referred to in the schedule set forth in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is a current expense of the Township, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purposes by the issuance of obligations of the Township pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey, and (3) each of said purposes shall be undertaken as a general improvement, no part of which shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this bond ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 7. To finance the purposes, bond anticipation notes of the Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$8,132,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this bond ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this bond ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

Section 8. Each bond anticipation note issued pursuant to this bond ordinance shall be dated on or about the date of its issuance and shall be payable not more than one year from its date, shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law and may be renewed from time to time pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor, the Director of Revenue and Finance and the Chief Financial Officer of the Township and shall be under the seal of said Township and attested by the Township Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue said notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this bond ordinance and also the power to sell said notes is hereby delegated to the Director of Revenue and Finance or the Chief Financial Officer who are each authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and declared that the average period of usefulness of the purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purposes, is a period of 16.18 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by the Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk of the Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of the Township, as defined in Section 40A:2-43 of the Local Bond Law is increased by this bond ordinance by \$8,132,000 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this bond ordinance will be within all debt limitations as prescribed by the Local Bond Law.

Section 11. The Township hereby declares the intent of the Township to issue the bonds or bond anticipation notes in the amount authorized in Section 2 of this bond ordinance and to use proceeds to pay or reimburse expenditures for the costs of the purposes described in Section 3(a) of this bond ordinance. This Section 11 is a declaration of intent within the meaning and for purposes of Treasury Regulations §1.150-2 or any successor provisions of federal income tax law.

Section 12. Any funds received from the State of New Jersey, or the County of Hudson or any of their agencies or any funds received from the United States of America or any of its agencies in aid of the purposes shall be applied to the payment of the cost of the purposes, or, if bond anticipation notes have been issued, to the payment of bond anticipation notes, and the amount of bonds authorized for the purposes shall be reduced accordingly.

Section 13. The Township hereby certifies that it has adopted a capital budget or a temporary capital budget, as applicable. The capital or temporary capital budget of the Township is hereby amended to conform with the provisions of this bond ordinance to the extent of any inconsistency herewith. To the extent that the purposes authorized herein are inconsistent with the adopted capital or temporary capital budget, a revised capital or temporary capital budget has been filed with the Division of Local Government Services.

The Township intends to issue the obligations authorized by this bond ordinance to finance the cost of each such purposes described in Section 3 hereof. The Township covenants for the benefit of the holders of the obligations authorized herein that it will not make any use of (a) the proceeds of such obligations, any funds reasonably expected to be used to pay the principal of or interest on such obligations or any other funds of the Township, and (b) the facilities or purposes financed with the proceeds of such obligations, which would cause the interest on such obligations to become subject to Federal income taxation under the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), (except for the alternative minimum tax imposed on corporations by Section 55 of the Code) or subject the Township to any penalties under Section 148 of the Code, and that it will not take any action or omit to take any action with respect to such obligations, the proceeds thereof or any facilities financed thereby if such action or omission would cause the interest on such obligations to become subject to Federal income taxation under the Code (except for the alternative minimum tax imposed on corporations by Section 55 of the Code) or subject the Township to any penalties under Section 148 of the Code. The foregoing covenants shall remain in full force and effect notwithstanding the defeasance of the obligations authorized herein or any other provision hereof until the date which is sixty (60) days after the final maturity date or earlier prior redemption date thereof. The Town hereby declares its official intent to reimburse itself from the proceeds of the bonds or notes authorized by this resolution pursuant to IRS Regulation Section 1.150-2(c), promulgated under the Code, for "original expenditures", as defined in said Regulation, made by the Township prior to the issuance of such bonds or notes. Such "original expenditures" shall not exceed the sum of \$8,560,000 in the aggregate and shall be paid from funds temporarily available from the Township's current funds.

Section 15. The Township hereby covenants for the benefit of holders of obligations authorized herein to comply with Rule 15c2-12 of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended

(the "Rule"), unless an exemption from the Rule exists as provided in paragraph (d) of the Rule.

Section 16. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen recognize that handicapped drivers face unique difficulties in the location of parking spaces; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen have been empowered by N.J.S.A. 39:4-205 to restrict certain areas for handicapped parking; and

WHEREAS, Ordinance No. 503-93, Ordinance No. 1115-07, Ordinance No. 40-10 and Ordinance No. 203-13 establish the terms and conditions for handicapped spaces.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen that:

Section 1: One restricted handicapped parking space be and hereby is established in front of the residence of Jose Quijije of 1319 – 6th Street, and Fernando Batista of 613 – 73rd St. Apt. 3L, North Bergen, N.J. 07047.

Section 2: The aforesaid space shall be used only by a motor vehicle displaying a permit issued by the North Bergen Police Department identifying the location of said handicapped parking space and the specific motor vehicle entitled to use same.

Section 3: The North Bergen Department of Public Works shall establish a restricted parking zone at the above location and shall erect a sign with the legend "Handicapped Parking for Resident Vehicle License Plate Number "2 8 0 2 H J" for Jose Quijije, "R 6 7 R C U" for Fernando Batista, and this Ordinance Number.

Section 4: This ordinance shall remain in effect for two (2) years ending December 31st of the second year from its effective date at which point it will expire and be of no further force or effect unless it is renewed for a further two (2) year period by formal resolution of the Board of Commissioners in accordance with Ordinance Nos. 1115-07 and 40-10.

Section 5: Any person who commits a violation of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of at least \$300.00 and up to 90 days of Community Service on such terms and in such form as the Municipal Court Judge deems appropriate or any combination thereof. A separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during or on which the violation continues.

Section 6: All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed as to the inconsistency thereof.

ORDINANCE ADOPTING OUTDOOR LANDSCAPE WATER CONSERVATION GUIDELINES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN that:

Section 1: Background & Findings

The Township of North Bergen ("Township") wishes to adopt environmentally sound and conservation minded guidelines and restrictions relative to landscape watering and irrigation. The regulations set forth herein will serve to conserve water and, therefore, positively impact our environment.

Section 2: Water Use Restrictions

Restrictions on outdoor landscape water use apply to all users in the Township at all times, regardless of source of supply (e.g. public water supplies, well or ground water, lakes, streams, or ponds), unless expressly exempt in **Section 5**. Such water use shall conform to the following Outdoor Landscape Water Use Restrictions:

- A. Lawn watering with a hose or hose-end sprinkler:
- (1) May only be done every other day as follows: properties with even number addresses may only water on even number calendar days, and properties with odd number addresses may only water on odd number calendar days;
- (2) Watering shall only be conducted between the hours of 6:00 a.m. and 9:00 a.m. or between 5:00 p.m. and 8:00 p.m.;
- (3) The watering of any single area shall not exceed 30 minutes per day;
- (4) Notwithstanding the forgoing **subsections 2A (1) to (3)**, flowers and shrubs may be watered as needed with a hand-held hose equipped with an automatic shut-off nozzle; and
- (5) No hose or hose-end watering shall be permitted when it is raining.
- B. Irrigating lawns and landscapes with automatic irrigation systems equipped with a conventional irrigation controller (this includes all systems that do not have a "SMART" controller as defined in **subsection C**):
 - (1) May only be done pursuant to the schedule set forth in subsection 1A(1);
 - (2) Irrigation shall only be conducted between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 10:00 a.m.; and
 - (3) Operation of any irrigation zone equipped with spray (mist) heads shall not exceed 15 minutes per zone. Operation of any irrigation zone equipped with rotary sprinkler heads shall not exceed 50 minutes per zone.
 - C. Irrigation with systems equipped with a SMART controller.

- (1) To qualify for this provision, the SMART controller must have met the minimum requirements of IA-SWAT protocol testing.
- (2) The property owner must register the SMART controller with the municipality.
 - (a) The municipality will issue a yard placard which the owner must display signifying that the property is irrigated with a SMART controller, or the Township may otherwise register the property as having such system.
- (3) The SMART controller must be programmed by an EPA WaterSense Partner who holds a New Jersey Landscape Irrigation Contractor Certificate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:5AA-3.
 - (a) The SMART controller must be programmed to irrigate between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 10:00 a.m.;
 - (b) Proper sprinkler head data and accurate soil/plant/irrigation information must be entered;
 - (c) The SMART controller programming data shall be posted at the controller; and
 - (d) The WaterSense Partner must make a minimum of two site visits after the initial programming to adjust and fine tune the irrigation schedule.
- D. Irrigation systems programmed and monitored by an irrigation manager.
- (1) The property owner must designate a qualified person who will be the irrigation manager and register that person with the Township with defining qualifications.
 - (a) The municipality will issue a yard placard which the owner must display signifying that the property is irrigated by an irrigation manager, or the Township may otherwise register the property as having such manager.
- (2) The irrigation manager must be an EPA WaterSense Partner or show evidence of successfully completing one of the approved courses listed below:
 - (a) Rutgers University Continuing Education Course, Irrigation Systems: Scheduling;
 - (b) Irrigation Association's online course, Landscape Irrigation Scheduling; or
 - (c) A comparable course offered by a recognized continuing education facility or professional association.
- (3) A property-specific irrigation program shall be developed by the irrigation manager based on plant variety, soil type, exposure, slope, precipitation rate, and irrigation efficiency.

- (4) Weekly adjustments shall be made to the irrigation schedule based on current evapotranspiration (ET) rates or weather conditions.
- (5) If it is found that an irrigation manager does not follow any of the terms prescribed in this **subsection 1D**, they may be disqualified from acting as a properties irrigation manager.
- E. Automatic irrigation systems.
- (1) All automatic irrigation systems shall be equipped with an operational automatic rain sensor device, which disables the system when a predetermined amount of rainfall has occurred. Each rain sensor device shall be capable of and programmed to interrupt the automatic irrigation cycle when a 1/4 inch of rain has fallen.
- (2) Any work performed on a system as a result of any inspection made by the homeowner or a professional must be in compliance with the Landscape Irrigation Contractor Certification Act of 1991 (N.J.S.A. 45:5AA-3).
- (3) Flowers and shrubs irrigated with drip or micro irrigation may be watered as needed.
- F. All new irrigation systems must comply with the following:
- (1) The system must be installed by an EPA WaterSense Partner who holds a New Jersey Landscape Irrigation Contractor Certificate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:5AA-3; and
- (2) New Jersey Irrigation Best Management Design Practices are listed below.
 - (a) Designing a system that insures sufficient operating pressure at the sprinkler head;
 - (b) Dividing irrigated areas into hydro-zones of turf and plants with similar water requirements;
 - (c) Creating zoning systems according to exposure;
 - (d) Considering the soil type so the sprinkler irrigation precipitation rate is compatible with the soil infiltration rate or dividing the zone runtimes into multiple short cycles;
 - (e) Providing separate control of sloped areas;
 - (f) Preventing sprinkler heads from overthrowing onto driveways, roads, and sidewalks;
 - (g) Providing for separate irrigation for parkway strips between curbs and sidewalks that minimizes overthrow onto walks, pavement, and other impervious surfaces;
 - (h) Using pressure regulating technology as necessary to ensure sprinkler heads operate within the manufacturer's recommended range. The pressure regulation may be:

- [1] A pressure regulation device at the point of connection;
- [2] Pressure regulation at each remote control valve;
- [3] Pressure regulation at the sprinkler head; or
- [4] A combination of the above;
- (i) Irrigating all flowers and shrubs with drip and/or micro-irrigation;
- (j) Including check valves in low sprinkler heads to prevent low-point drainage; and
- (k) Having a pressure regulating device and wye strainer on each drip/micro control valve.
- (3) The system must have a SMART controller capable of estimating or measuring depletion of available plant soil moisture and operating the irrigation system only to replenish the water as needed while minimizing excess water use.
 - (a) The SMART controller must have undergone SWAT testing, or contain WaterSense labeling.
 - (b) The SMART controller must be programmed by an EPA WaterSense Partner who holds a New Jersey Landscape Irrigation Contractor Certificate pursuant to N.J.S.A. 45:5AA-3.
 - [1] Proper sprinkler head data and accurate soil/plant/irrigation information must be entered;
 - [2] The SMART controller programming data shall be posted at the controller; and
 - [3] The WaterSense partner must make a minimum of two site visits after the initial programming to adjust and fine tune the irrigation schedule.
- G. Upon the declaration of water emergency by the Township additional restrictions may be imposed and shall supersede the restrictions in this Ordinance.
- H. State of New Jersey requirements shall supersede those identified in this Ordinance when more stringent than those identified herein.

Section 3: Enforcement of Water Conservation Guidelines

The water use restrictions and automatic rain sensor requirement imposed pursuant to this Ordinance shall be enforced by any personnel authorized pursuant to Ordinance No.# 550-22. Whenever a person authorized to enforce this Ordinance observes a violation of the water use restrictions, regardless of the source of the water (public supply or private source), such authorized official shall issue a written warning and explain the penalties for a first and subsequent offense, as provided in **Section 4**. The Building Department shall keep such records as may be reasonable and necessary for the purpose of determining the persons and businesses who have been warned.

Section 4. <u>Violations and penalties</u>

- A. Violations include knowingly or recklessly watering or irrigating or permitting irrigation of lawn or landscape on owned, leased, or managed property that results in the following:
 - (1) Watering during any form of precipitation;
 - (2) Water leaking from any irrigation equipment;
 - (3) Water puddling on landscape or impervious surfaces;
 - (4) Water run-off from irrigated property;
 - (5) Irrigating on days not permitted in this Ordinance; and
 - (6) Irrigating at hours not permitted in this Ordinance.
- B. All water users in the Township are responsible for preventing the above violations.
- C. Any person who violates any provision of this Ordinance shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine not to exceed \$100 for a first offense and not to exceed \$200 for a second or subsequent offense, all in the discretion of the Municipal Court Judge.
- D. The penalty provided for in **subsection C** and the imposition thereof shall not constitute a bar to or be deemed in substitution of the exercise of any right or power or remedy of the Township provided for in this Ordinance or under any other Township Ordinance.

Section 5: Exemptions

The restrictions contained in this Ordinance do not apply to the following:

- A. Outdoor water use from rainwater harvesting, gray water, or reclaimed water are exempt from the provisions of this Ordinance. Use of gray or reclaimed water must have an approved NJPDES permit issued through the NJDEP.
- B. Outdoor water use for commercial farms producing harvestable crops, and commercial nurseries are exempt from the provisions of this Ordinance.
- C. Outdoor irrigation necessary for one day only where treatment with an application of chemicals require immediate watering to preserve an existing landscape or to establish a new landscape.
- D. Outdoor irrigation necessary for the establishment of newly sodded lawns or landscaping within the first 21 consecutive days of planting.
- E. Visually supervised operation of an irrigation system by a person in compliance with the New Jersey Landscape Irrigation Contractor Certification Act of 1991 (N.J.S.A. 45:5AA-1) and at the minimum rate necessary in order to check system condition and effectiveness.

Section 6: Severability

If any part or parts of this Ordinance are for any reason held to be invalid, such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Ordinance.

Section 7: Repealer

All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed as to the inconsistency thereof.

Section 8: Effective Date:

This Ordinance shall take effect 20 days from the time of its final passage.
