

AN ORDINANCE FIXING THE SALARIES OF THE
MAYOR AND COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP
OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON.

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WHEREAS the salaries of the Mayor and Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen originally fixed in 1931 should be increased owing to the devaluation of the purchasing power of the dollar,

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: That the annual salary of the Mayor of the said Township is hereby fixed at \$3,500.00 and the annual salaries of each Commissioner is hereby fixed at \$3,000.00.

Section 2: This ordinance shall take effect ten days after the publication thereof after its final passage.

AN ORDINANCE PERMITTING THE DELL REALTY COMPANY TO CONTINUE
AN ENCROACHMENT OVER THE NORTHERLY SIDE OF 29TH STREET

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen, in the
County of Hudson do ordain:-

Section 1: Permission is hereby granted to the Dell Realty Company,
a corporation of New Jersey to maintain a presently existing encroachment
over the northerly side of the building line of 29th Street in the Town-
ship of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, wherein a certain 3 story
brick building designated as 2900 Tonnelle Avenue, erected on lot number
24 block 64 as shown on the Township Tax Map beginning, (1) in the westerly
side of said building at a point in the northerly side of 29th Street distant
15 feet 7/8 inch easterly of the easterly line of Tonnelle Avenue and going
thence 36 feet 9 inches to the easterly face of said building; thence, (2)
southerly along the easterly face of said building 6 5/8 inches to a point
in the southerly face of said building; thence, (3) westerly along the
southerly face of said building 36 feet 9 1/4 inches to the westerly face of
said building; thence, (4) northerly along the westerly face of said build-
ing 5/8 inches to the point and place of beginning.

Section 2: The permission granted is to continue only until the said
building hereinabove referred to is demolished, removed or substantially
rebuilt.

Section 3: All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith
are repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

Section 4: This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption and
publication as required by law.

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**SUNDAY OF CERTAIN GOODS, WARES AND MERCHANDISE IN THE TOWNSHIP
OF NORTH BERGEN.**

WHEREAS the general and immemorial policy of the State of New Jersey, as indicated by the Vice and Immorality Act, has been to set aside Sunday as a day of rest and to prohibit the prosecution of any business or calling, except those specifically excluded by statute or those generally excluded as works of necessity and charity; and

WHEREAS our courts have consistently stated that ordinances may be adopted by municipalities in the furtherance and strengthening of the long settled policy of the state against secular activity on Sunday; and

WHEREAS municipalities in their discretion may adopt ordinances to strengthen the state statute by enacting larger pecuniary penalties, together with a physical deterrent of imprisonment;

**THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP
OF NORTH BERGEN DOES ORDAIN:**

1. No person shall expose for sale or sell on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday (except as hereinafter provided), any wares, merchandise, goods or chattels, of any kind whatsoever; nor shall any person on said day cause or permit any store or other place owned, occupied, conducted or managed by him or her, to be open for the purpose of selling or bartering any wares, merchandise, goods or chattels, of any kind whatsoever; provided that the aforesaid provisions shall not apply to or be held to prohibit the sale or keeping open stores or other places for the purpose of selling drugs, medical supplies, toiletries and allied articles, ice, milk, delicatessen, groceries, flowers, cigars and tobacco, confectionary, ice cream, non-alcoholic beverages, or alcoholic beverages regulated by Title 33 of the Revised Statutes; nor prohibit walking, riding, or driving for recreation, the hiring of conveyances for riding and driving, or the engaging in or taking any form of recreation, sport or amusement that is not unlawful on any other day of the week and does not disturb others in their observance of the Sabbath; nor prohibit the selling and serving of meals and refreshments in hotel, restaurants, lunchrooms and bakeries; nor prohibit the sale of automobiles, service and parts, printing and distribution of newspapers and periodicals, or the carrying on of the business of photography.

2. The aforesaid prohibition shall likewise apply to New Year's Day, Memorial Day, Independence Day, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas.

3. Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished by the payment of a fine of not more than TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.00), or imprisonment in the County Jail for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both.

4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed.

5. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.

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AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED
"AN ORDINANCE DEDICATING CERTAIN PARCELS OF
LANDS IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE
COUNTY OF HUDSON AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, FOR
USE AS PARKS AND PLAYGROUNDS, adopted DECEMBER
19th, 1951", as amended;

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen
in the County of Hudson, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. That Section 1, of an ordinance entitled as
above be amended by adding thereto paragraph H;

H. Southeasterly corner of Union Turnpike and Grand Avenue,
in Block 79, and known as Plot 16 and Plot 17.

Section 2. That said Park and Playground shall be under the
supervision of the Department of Parks and Public Property.

Section 3. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in
conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed as to the conflicting
portions thereof.

Section 4. That this ordinance take effect after adoption
and publication thereof as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE PERMITTING AN ENCROACHMENT TO
CONTINUE OVER THE WESTERLY LINE OF BERGENLINE
AVENUE AND OVER THE SOUTHERLY LINE OF 81st
STREET IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN COUNTY
OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY.

WHEREAS Marcella Feretti has determined that an encroachment of building located on Block 381-Lot 1 exists over the westerly line of Bergenline Avenue and over the southerly line of 81st Street in accordance with a survey hereto attached; and

WHEREAS the said Marcella Feretti has requested the adoption of an ordinance permitting the continuation of said encroachments, now therefore

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Permission is hereby granted to Marcella Feretti, her successors or assigns to maintain a presently existing encroachment over the westerly building line of Bergenline Avenue in the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, of a certain two story building designated as 8023 Bergenline Avenue, erected on Lot #1 Block 381 as shown on the Township Tax Map, said encroachment having the width of 9 3/4 inches at the southeasterly corner of said building and reduced to 7 3/4 inches at the northeasterly corner of said building, and also encroachment for a width of 7 1/4 inches over the northeasterly corner of said building and widening to two feet 11 7/8 inches at the north-westerly corner of a one story building erected in the westerly portion of the abovementioned lot and encroaching over the southerly building line of 81st Street.

Section 2. The permission granted to maintain the above encroachments is to continue only until the said buildings hereinabove referred to are demolished, removed or substantially rebuilt provided, however that during the continuance of said encroachments, the said owner, her successors or assigns shall pay to the Township of North Bergen an encroachment fee which shall be computed to equal the annual general property tax on an assessment of \$300.00, which said amount shall be paid to the Collector of Taxes together with the other charges payable against the above described premises.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption and publication as required by law.
