

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. No person within the territorial limits of the Township of North Bergen shall solicit, ask or request by signal, gesture, voice or any other means a ride or transportation for himself, herself or others from the driver or operator of any vehicle being operated on a public highway, other than an omnibus, taxi cab or other vehicle duly licensed to carry passengers for hire.

Section 2. Any person found guilty of violating this ordinance shall be liable to a penalty of not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisonment for a term not exceeding fifteen (15) days or both.

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent or in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published according to law.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, DO ORDAIN as follows:

Section 1. The Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, shall acquire new automotive vehicles consisting of three garbage trucks together with the original appurtenances and equipment necessary and suitable for their use.

Section 2. The sum of \$115,000 is hereby appropriated to the payment of the cost of acquiring such three new garbage trucks for such purpose. Such appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the down payment provided, by this ordinance. Said acquisition shall be undertaken as a general improvement and no part of the cost thereof shall be assessed against property especially benefited.

Section 3. It is hereby determined and stated that (1) the making of such improvement (hereinafter referred to as "purpose") is not a current expense of said Township, and (2) it is necessary to finance said purpose by the issuance of obligations of said Township pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey, and (3) the estimated cost of said purpose is \$115,000, and (4) \$5,750 of said sum is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance said purpose, and (5) the estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes necessary to be issued for said purpose is \$109,250, and (6) the cost of such purpose, as hereinafore stated, includes the aggregate amount of \$5,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purpose, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and for other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 40A:2-20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 4. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$5,750, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Township are now available to finance said purpose. The sum of \$5,750 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purpose.

Section 5. To finance said purpose, bonds of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$109,250 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to said Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined within the limitations prescribed by law. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 6. To finance said purpose, bond anticipation notes of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$109,250 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to said Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall be reduced by an amount equal to the principal amount of the bonds so issued. If the aggregate amount of outstanding bonds and notes issued pursuant to this ordinance shall at any time exceed the sum first mentioned in this section, the moneys raised by the issuance of said bonds shall, to not less than the amount of such excess, be applied to the payment of such notes then outstanding.

ordinance and also the power to sell said notes, is hereby delegated to the Director of the Department of Revenue and Finance who is hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 8. It is hereby determined and declared that the period of usefulness of said purpose, according to its reasonable life, is a period of 5 years computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 9. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk of said Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Township, as defined in Section 40A:2-43 of said Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$109,250 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 10. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

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The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson finds and determines that it is necessary and expedient for the preservation of the public health, safety, general welfare or to eliminate a fire hazard, to require the removal or destruction of brush, weeds, including ragweed, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growth, filth, garbage, trash and debris upon lands situated, lying and being in the municipality.

Section 2: The owner or tenant of lands situated, lying and being in the municipality, shall within 10 days after receipt of notice from the Township Health Officer, remove or destroy all brush, weeds, including ragweed, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growths, filth, garbage, trash and debris thereon, and in the event the owner or tenant of the said lands refuses or neglects to remove or destroy the same, in the manner or within the prescribed period of 10 days, such a removal or destruction shall be undertaken by or under the direction of the Township Health Officer and the cost of such removal or destruction shall become a fine or charge upon said lands as provided herein, pursuant to N.J.S.A. 40:48-2.13 and 40:48-2.14.

Section 3: In all cases where brush, weeds, including ragweed, dead and dying trees, stumps, roots, obnoxious growth, filth, garbage, trash and debris are destroyed or removed from any lands situated, lying and being in the municipality under this ordinance by or under the direction of the Township Health Officer shall certify the cost thereof to the governing body, which shall examine the certificate, and if found correct shall cause the cost as shown thereon to be charged against said lands; the amount so charged shall forthwith become a fine or charge upon such lands and shall be added to and become and form part of the taxes next to be assessed and levied upon such lands, the same to bear interest at the same rate as taxes, and shall be collected and enforced by the same officers and in the same manner as taxes.

Section 4: If any section, clause, phrase, or portion of this ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the remaining portion hereof.

Section 1. It shall be unlawful to operate any type of unlicensed motor driven vehicle or conveyance, including, but not necessarily limited to snowmobiles, two-wheel motor vehicles known as mini-bicycles, trail bicycles, motor scooters and four-wheel vehicles known as go-carts under the following circumstances:

- A. On private property of another without the express permission to do so by the owner or occupant of said property.
- B. On any public street located within the Township of North Bergen.
- C. On public grounds without the express provisions or permission to do so by the proper public authority.
- D. In a manner so as to create loud, unnecessary or unusual noise so as to disturb or interfere with the peace and quiet of other persons.
- E. In a careless, reckless or negligent manner so as to endanger the safety of any person or the property of any other person.

Section 2. This ordinance shall not apply to police and emergency vehicles.

Section 3. This ordinance shall not be applied to any recognized organization which has applied to the Township Commission of the Township of North Bergen for specific use privileges to specified town-owned lands and premises for the purposes of having organized and supervised activities conducted thereon, so long as an insurance policy is filed with the Township Clerk of the Township of North Bergen naming the Township of North Bergen as an assured, for which the Township Commission of the Township of North Bergen has given its specific approval, and for which the Township of North Bergen shall be held from liability from any such use of its land and premises.

Section 4. The police shall immediately confiscate the unlicensed motor driven vehicle operated in the prohibited areas or in the prohibited manner described in Section 1. of this ordinance. The unlicensed motor driven vehicle shall be returned upon payment of the fine or upon direction of the court.

Section 1. The Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey shall make improvements and acquire new parks and public playgrounds located in the Township of North Bergen maintained by the Township as places of public resort and recreation, together with all appurtenances necessary and suitable for the use of such improvements. The improvements described in Section 3 of this ordinance are hereby respectively authorized to be undertaken by the Township of North Bergen. There is hereby appropriated to the acquisition of such new equipment and the making of the improvements described in Section 3 hereof (hereinafter referred to as "purposes") the respective amounts of money hereinafter stated as the appropriation for the said respective purposes. Such appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of the sale of the bonds authorized, and the down payment appropriated by this ordinance.

Section 2. The improvements and the acquisition of the equipment described in the "Schedule of Purposes and Amounts" shall be constructed or acquired. The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen has ascertained and hereby determines that (1) none of the purposes referred to in the schedule set forth in Section 3 of this ordinance is a current expense of said Township, and (2) it is necessary to finance said respective purposes by the issuance of obligations of said Township pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey, and (3) each of said purposes shall be undertaken as a general improvement, no part of the cost of which shall be assessed against property specially benefited.

Section 3. The several purposes hereby authorized for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued, are set forth in the following "Schedule of Purposes and Amounts", which schedule also shows (1) the estimated cost of each such purpose, and (2) the amount of each such sum which is to be provided by the down payment hereinafter appropriated to finance the respective purpose, and (3) the estimated maximum amount of bonds and notes to be issued for each such purpose, and (4) the period of probable usefulness of each such purpose, according to its reasonable life, computed from the date of said bonds:

Section 4. The cost of such purposes, as hereinafore stated includes the aggregate amount of \$75,000 which is estimated to be necessary to finance the cost of such purposes, including architect's fees, accounting, engineering and inspection costs, legal expenses and other expenses, including interest on such obligations to the extent permitted by Section 40A:2-20 of the Local Bond Law.

Section 5. It is expected that the State of New Jersey will contribute to the Township and reimburse the Township the sum of \$157,500 for the improvements described as purpose 1. Such sum will be received from the Department of Environmental Protection pursuant to the Land and Water Conservation Fund Program of the State of New Jersey. Any of such funds received shall be applied to the purpose and the amount of bonds authorized reduced accordingly.

Section 6. It is hereby determined and stated that moneys exceeding \$21,500, appropriated for down payments on capital improvements or for the capital improvement fund in budgets heretofore adopted for said Township are now available to finance said purposes. The sum of \$21,500 is hereby appropriated from such moneys to the payment of the cost of said purposes.

Section 7. To finance said purposes, bonds of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$408,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to said Local Bond Law. Said bonds shall bear interest at a rate per annum as may be hereafter determined with the limitations prescribed by law All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereafter adopted.

Section 8. To finance said purposes, bond anticipation notes of said Township of an aggregate principal amount not exceeding \$408,500 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to said Local Bond Law in anticipation of the issuance of said bonds. In the event that bonds are issued pursuant to this ordinance, the aggregate amount of notes hereby authorized to be issued shall

renewed from time to time pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by the Local Bond Law. Each of said notes shall be signed by the Mayor and by the Director of the Department of Revenue and Finance, and shall be under the seal of said Township and attested by the Township Clerk. Said officers are hereby authorized to execute said notes and to issue notes in such form as they may adopt in conformity with law. The power to determine any matters with respect to said notes not determined by this ordinance and also the power to seal said notes, is hereby delegated to the Director of the Department of Revenue and Finance, who are hereby authorized to sell said notes either at one time or from time to time in the manner provided by law.

Section 10. It is hereby determined and stated that the average period of usefulness of said purposes, according to their reasonable lives, taking into consideration the respective amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purposes, is a period of 15 yrs., computed from the date of said bonds.

Section 11. It is hereby determined and stated that the Supplemental Debt Statement required by said Local Bond Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk of said Township, and that such statement so filed shows that the gross debt of said Township, defined in Section 40A:2-43 of said Local Bond Law, is increased by this ordinance by \$408,500 and that the issuance of the bonds and notes authorized by this ordinance will be within all debt limitations prescribed by said Local Bond Law.

Section 12. This ordinance shall take effect twenty days after the first publication thereof after final passage.

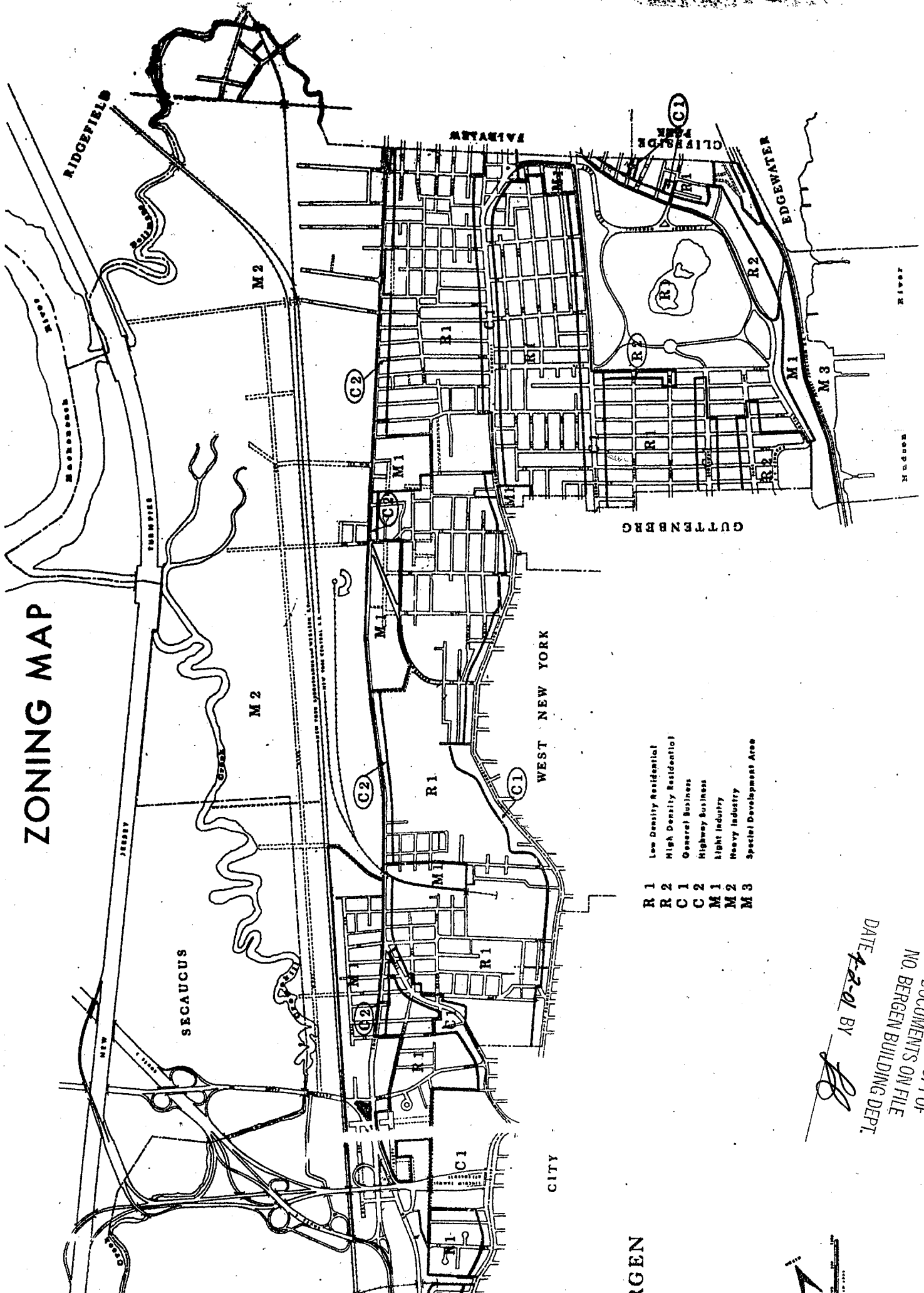

Section 1. Adoption of sub-division ordinance. That a certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the township clerk of the township of North Bergen, being marked and designated as sub-division ordinance, be and is hereby adopted as the sub-division ordinance of the township of North Bergen, Hudson County, New Jersey, for the regulation of sub-division of land and further regulations in connection with the erection or construction and use of any structure, street sewer, water main proposed to be erected, constructed, maintained or used in connection with said sub-division.

Section 2. Interpretation. In the interpretation and the application of the provisions of this ordinance, they shall be held to be the minimum requirements for the promotion of the public health, safety, morals and general welfare. It is not intended to interfere with or abrogate or annul other rules, regulations or ordinances, provided that where this ordinance imposes greater restrictions upon the use of buildings or premises or upon the height or bulk of a building, or requires larger open spaces, the provisions of this ordinance shall control.

Section 3. Saving clause. Nothing in this ordinance or in the sub-division regulations hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding now pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, not any cause or causes of action accrued or existing, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

Section 4. Validity. If any section, subsection sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance is for any reason held by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such a decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance.

Section 5. Repealer. Inconsistent ordinances repealed and all other ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Section 6. Effective date. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon the adoption hereof.
