# TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN HUDSON COUNTY, N.J.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE CONSTRUCTION, ERECTION, RE-MOVAL OR DEMOLITION OF ANY BUILDING OR STRUCTURE OR ANY PART OF FITHER, TO REGULATE AND CONTROL PUBLIC AND OTHER AUTOMOBILE GARAGES AND THE REMOVAL OR CUTTING AWAY OF ANY PORTION OF ANY IMPROVED STREET SURFACE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON," DESIGNATED AS "THE BUILDING CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON," ADOPTED AUGUST 23, 1923.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: That section 24 paragraph E of an ordinance entitled as above be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows:

Reinforced concrete structures shall be so designed that unit stresses in pounds per square inch shall not exceed the Standards set forth in American Standard Association, Inc. 70 East 45th Street, New York 17, N.Y., hereinafter designated "ASA", the American Concrete Institute 18263 W. Mc Nicholas Road, Detroit 19 Michigan, hereinafter designated "AC1" set forth in the following table:

Building code requirements for reinforced concrete ASA A89.1 1951 Building code requirements for ready mixed concrete ASA A37.69 1951 Compressive strength of concrete ASA A37.24 1951 Flexural strength of concrete ASA A37.22 1951 Design or reinforced concrete AC1 318-53

Section 2: That section 29 Working Stresses and Load paragraph D lines 1 to 8 shall be amended to read as follows:

The safe carrying capacity of the various materials of construction except in the case of columns shall be determined by the working stresses in pounds per square inch specified in this section. Where mill test reports are submitted, the Engineering Department may permit unit stresses on structural steel in tension on the net section, butt welds section through throad, rivets on area based on nominal diameter, bolts and other threaded parts on nominal diameter at root of thread of 20,000 pounds per square inch. For columns in compression axially loaded with the ratio of the length to the radius of gyration not greater than 120 the unit stress shall be computed as

17,000 - 0.485  $\frac{1^2}{r}$  pounds per square inch. When  $\frac{1}{r}$  exceeds 120 the unit stress shall be computed as  $18,000/1+\frac{1^2}{18,000r}$  per square inch.

Designs for steel construction shall conform to Part IV Manual of American Institue of Steel Construction Standard Specifications and Code 1954 101 Park Avenue, New York 17, N. Y., hereinafter designated as AISC.

Section 3: That section 31 of said ordinance be amended by adding thereto paragraph L to read as follows:

Every plan filed shall have shown thereon the unit floor

Section 5: That section 57 paragraph B3 of said ordinance be amended by adding thereto, "Creosoted piles impregnated under pressure with not less than 15 pounds of creosote per cubic foot of wood for southern yellow pine or red oak piling and 12 pounds of creosote per cubic foot of wood for douglas fir piling may be cut off above water level, provided that the top surface is coated with hot pitch before placing of concrete or other capping material.

Section 6: That section 59 of said ordinance be amended to read as follows:

A separate building permit shall not be required for a garage forming a part of a building occupied as a dwelling where the occupancy of said garage does not exceed two private automobiles, provided that not more than two stories above the garage be intended to be occupied as living quarters. Such garages shall be separated from living quarters by a fire retardant wall not less than 8" thick, concrete floor, fire retardant ceiling with not less than two 3/4" layers of cement plaster on wire lath, and not pierced by more than one opening leading to the living quarters protected by a self closing fire proof door and further provided than an independent entrance be provided for the living quarters without passing through the garage. In case the building is occupied by more than two families or on two stories above the garage, a fire escape or second means of passage must be provided for each story above the garage. All garages whether private of public must be properly vented for the removal of noxious gases or fumes.

Section 7: That an amendment to said ordinance adopted June 21, 1944, be repealed.

Section 8: That a supplement to said ordinance adopted January 26, 1928, be repealed.

Section 9: That an amendment to an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance to Amend and Ordinance Entitled "An Ordinance to Regulate Garages, in the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, N.J.", Adopted July 26th, 1928", adopted February 6, 1946, be repealed.

Section 10: That section 64 of said ordinance be amended to read as follows:

The Engineering Department shall be empowered to grant minor modifications of any sections of this ordinance, provided the modification does not weaken the construction or materially change the intent or purpose of this ordinance using as a guide for such modification the Standard Building Code of New Jersey prepared pursuant to Laws of 1946 Chapter 120 and accompanying manual approved December 23, 1953, together with such other nationally recognized manuals.

Section 11: This ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: That the map entitled "Tax Map Township of North Bergen, Hudson County, New Jersey, October 1, 1954, Joshus Muss Township Engineer", consisting of a Title Sheet, Index Sheets 1 to 7 inclusive and Atlas Sheets 8 to 110 inclusive, which said map was approved on March 15, 1955 under serial number 168 by C. E. Barnes Supervisor, Division of Taxation, Department of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey, as a Tax Map as provided in Chapter 175 Laws of 1913 (Revised Statutes 54:1-15 Chapter 167, Laws of 1939 and Chapter 92, Laws of 1948), be, and the same is hereby adopted as the Official Tax Map of the Township of North Bergen.

Section 3; That all roads, streets, evenues and highways shown on the above described map heretofore dedicated or set aside for public use, not heretofore accepted by the township for public use are hereby accepted as dedicated streets for public use.

Section 4: Thet all ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof and that this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A MEALTH DEPARTMENT IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BEAGEN IS THE COUNTY

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudion DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. There is hereby established in the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, a Health Department, consisting of seven members.

Section 2. They shall be appointed for a term of one year by the Director of the Department to whom the said Health Department has been assigned.

Section 3. Each member shall be entitled to receive compensation for services in the sum of \$500.00 per annum.

Section 4. It shall be the duty of the members of the Health Department to give such advice or assistance on matters pertaining to the public health as the Board of Commissioners functioning as the Board of Health may require.

Section 5. Said Health Department shall prepare and recommend for adoption by the said Board of Commissioners, ordinances, rules and regulations in regard to public health, in furtherance of the lawful purposes conferred upon local Boards of Health pursuant to the provision of Article 2 of Title 26 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey.

Section 6. The said Department shall keep a record of all matters pertaining to the public health in North Bergen, and for such purpose, the said members thereof may appoint a clerk to hold office for one year, at an annual salary of \$500.00 per annum.

Section 7. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

Section 1. The number of wards in the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson shall be increased to Six and the lines and boundaries of such wards shall be fixed in such manner that the said wards shall be formed of contiguous territory with approximately equal population.

Section 2. When this ordinance becomes effective the Mayor shall appoint four Commissioners who shall be residents and legal voters of the Township of North Bergen, not more than two of whom shall be of the same political party, to fix and define the lines and boundaries of such wards.

Section 3. Within sixty days after their appointment, the said Commissioners shall make their report to the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson and State of New Jersey, and file it with the Township Clerk, in which report the boundaries and dividing lines of such wards shall be properly described, with a statement of the population of each ward as nearly as can be ascertained a map showing the lines and the extent and boundaries of such wards shall be made and filed by the Commissioners with their report.

Section 4. All necessary expenses of the Commissioners, and the compensation for their services and for the services of a surveyor and/or other assistants employed by them, shall be fixed by the Board of Commissioners by resolution, and paid by the Township.

Section 5. Ten days after the making and filing of the report of the said Commissioners, the lines and boundaries of such wards shall be as set forth in the report of the Commissioners, and all other and former ward lines, boundaries and designations shall thereupon be abclished and the wards so designated and described by the Commissioners' report shall be and continue to be, the wards of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson and State of New Jersey.

Section 6. As soon as is permissible, the said Commissioners shall divide each of the said wards as fixed pursuant to this ordinance, into election districts in a manner agreeable to the provisions of RS. 19:4-6.

Section 7. All ordinances and parts of ordinances conflicting with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

Section 66. (a) There shall be appointed in the Township of North Bergen, a Bullding Inspector who shall be a practical builder, or shall be versed in the erection of buildings.

- (b) The said building inspector shall hold office for the statutory term of four years from the first day of January in the year in which he is appointed.
- (c) He shall receive such compensation as is provided in an ordinance entitled "An ordinance Adopting Classification Schedule; Salary Hange Schedule and Duties Classification Schedule of the Officers and Employees of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson" adopted April 7, 1948, and the several amendments thereof and supplements thereto.
- (d) It shall be the duty of the building inspector to examine, for approval or disapproval, all plans and/or specifications submitted pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance, and if he approves the same, to issue the permit or permits required to be issued, and to supervise for the municipality the erection of the buildings or structures erected under the terms of any permit so granted; it shall be the further duty of such building inspector generally to enforce the laws of the State of New Jersey, this ordinance and any other ordinance now or hereafter to be adopted by the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, regulating and/or controling the construction, erection, alteration, repair, raising, removal or demolition of any building or structure, or of any part of either, within the limits of the Township.

Section 2. All ordinances, or parts of ordinances that conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portion thereof, and this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AR ORDINANCE TO VACISTE A PORTION OF TWENTY-NIETH STREET FORMERLY KNOWN AS GROVE STREET OF ATLAS STREET, HUNNING FROM PATLESON PLANK HOAD TO HIGHLAND AVENUE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUBSON AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

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WHEREAS a certain map entitled "Map of Homestead Station, North Bergen, Hudson County, New Jersey by Fouquet & Reyer, Surveyors, dated 1868" was duly filed in the Office of the Register of the County of Hudson and State of New Jersey as Map No. 497, and

WHEHEAS the said map provided for the creation of scertain street shown thereon as Grove Street or Atlas Street (now 29th Street) running from the easterly line of Paterson Plank Road to the westerly line of Highland Avenue, and

WHEREAS the said street or land has never been used as a public street or highway, and

WHEHEAS it is deemed advisable and in the best interests of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Endson that said strip of land be vacated at the request of Aldo Bartolucci and Armand Bartolucci, the owners of the property immediately affected thereby, and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson as follows:

l. That a certain street known and designated as Grove Street or Atlas Street (now 29th Street) described as follows:

Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the easterly side of line of the Paterson Plank Road and the southerly side or line of Twenty-minth Street (formerly known as Grove Street or Atlas Street) and running thence (1) northerly along the easterly side or line of Paterson Plank Road 62.78° to the northerly side or line of Twenty-minth Street, thence (2) easterly and along the northerly side or line of Twenty-ninth Street 193.61° to the westerly side or line of Highland Avenue (now known as Columbia Avenue) thence (3) southerly 61.08 feet to a point in the southerly side or line of Twenty-minth Street, which point is distant easterly from the Paterson Plank Road 190.24', thence (4) westerly and along the southerly side or line of Twenty-ninth Street 190.24° to the essterly side of the Faterson Plank Road the point or place of beginning, as shown on the map entitled "Map of Homestesd Station, North Bergen, Hudson County, New Jersey, by Fouquet & Beyer, Surveyors, dated 1868" and known as Map No. 437 beretofore dedicated for use as a public street or highway is hereby vacated.

2. Excepting however and notwithstanding this vacation the Township of North Bergen in the County of Rudson does nereby reserve the right to enter upon said vacated street to lay down, maintain and connect storm and sanitary sewer lines and to do all things necessary to properly maintain the storm and sanitary sewer lines in and upon said vacated street, provided however, that should the said Aldo Bertellunci and however.
