Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1. That the street hereinbefore referred to and shown on the Tax Map of the Township of North Bergen and designated as

Smith Avenue (Formerly Pennsylvania Avenue or First Street) from the Northerly Line of Map of Clinton Realty Company to the Bergen County Line

which said street was dedicated to the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson by an ordinance adopted on December 16, 1953, amendments thereof and supplements thereto; be, and the same is hereby vacated for use as public street or highway.

Section 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with this ordinance or any part hereof are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

Section 3. That this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF  
\$75,000.00 FOR SCHOOL PURPOSES AND  
AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF SCHOOL  
BONDS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN  
IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY,  
TO MEET SAID APPROPRIATION

WHEREAS the Board of Education of the Township of  
North Bergen has, pursuant to the provisions of R.S. 18;6-59,  
decided that it is necessary to raise money for the repairing  
of Jefferson School #7 on Eleventh Street in the Township of  
North Bergen and

WHEREAS the Board of School Estimate has fixed and  
determined the amount necessary for such purpose to be the  
sum of \$75,000.00

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH  
BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Title 18  
of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey, particularly Article 8  
of Chapter 6 of said Title, and any other laws applicable  
thereto, the sum of \$75,000.00 is hereby appropriated for the  
said purpose of ~~the construction of~~ repairing Jefferson School  
#7 on Eleventh Street in the Township of North Bergen

exceeding \$75,000.00 are hereby authorized and shall be issued pursuant to said local budget law, said bonds to be designated "school bonds" and shall bear interest from their date at a rate which shall not exceed 6% per annum. All matters with respect to said bonds not determined by this ordinance shall be determined by resolutions to be hereinafter adopted.

Section 4. The Board of Commissioners, being the governing body of the Township, hereby concurs in and consents to the said appropriation and in and to the issuance of said bonds.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the period within which the said bonds shall mature, being within the period assigned by section 18:6-66 of the Revised Statutes to the purpose for which said bonds are issued, is thirty-five (35) years.

Section 6. To temporarily finance the purposes aforesaid the sum of \$75,000.00 is hereby appropriated out of the appropriations heretofore made pursuant to the local budget law for the Capital Improvement Fund of said Township, said sum of \$75,000.00 to be paid to the Custodian of School Monies of the Township to be paid out by him only upon warrants or orders of the Board of Education for the purpose aforesaid, said monies to be repaid to the said Capital Improvement Fund upon the issuance and sale of the permanent bonds authorized by this ordinance.

\$75,000.00 bonds provided for by this ordinance uses up none of the borrowing margin of the Township previously available ~~of~~ for other improvements.

Section 8. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds. Said bonds shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ~~and~~ ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 9. This ordinance shall take effect ~~on~~ ~~ADoption AND~~ after its publication and ~~final passage~~ as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT THE  
MAKING OF UNNECESSARY NOISE.

\* \* \* \* \*

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, do ordain:

Section 1: That it is hereby declared to be a nuisance and it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to make, cause or suffer or permit to be made or caused upon any premises owned, occupied or controlled by him or it, or upon any public street, alley or thoroughfare in the Township of North Bergen, any unnecessary noises or sounds by means of the human voice, or by any other means or methods which are physically annoying to persons, or which are so harsh, or so prolonged or unnatural, or unusual in their use, time and place as to occasion physical discomfort or which are injurious to the lives, health, peace and comfort of the inhabitants of said city, or any number thereof.

Section 2: That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to play, use, operate or permit to be played, used or operated any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph or other machine or device for the production or reproduction of sound with louder volume than is necessary for convenient hearing of the person so playing, using or operating such instrument or device and such persons who are voluntary listeners thereto, or in such manner as to disturb the peace, quiet and comfort of neighboring inhabitants. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to prohibit playing by a band or orchestra in a hall, building or in the open air.

Section 3: That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation for advertising purposes or for the purpose of attracting the attention of the passing public, to play, use, operate, or permit to be played, used or operated any radio receiving set, musical instrument, phonograph, loud speaker, sound amplifier, or other machine or device for the producing or reproducing of sound on the streets or public places in the Township of North Bergen or any place where the sound therefrom is cast directly upon the streets or public places or which is so placed and operated that the sound therefrom can be heard to the annoyance or inconvenience of travelers upon any street or public place, or of persons in neighboring premises.

Section 4: That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, either as principal, agent or employee, to play, use or operate for advertising purposes, or for any other purpose whatsoever, on or upon the public streets, alleys or thoroughfares in the Township of North Bergen, any device known as sound truck, loud speaker or sound amplifier, or radio or phonograph with a loud speaker or sound amplifier, or any other instrument known as a caliope or any instrument of any kind or character which emits therefrom loud and raucous noises and is attached to and upon any vehicle operated or standing upon said streets or public places aforementioned.

"The dedicated revenues anticipated during the year 1958 from service connections where authorized by proper authority and costs are hereby appropriated for the purposes to which said revenue is dedicated dog licenses, solid fuel licenses, and deposits for main extensions and chargeable to such deposits are hereby anticipated as revenue and are by statute or other legal requirement."

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ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR IMPROVEMENT AND ENLARGEMENT OF THE SEWERAGE SYSTEM OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, APPROPRIATING \$4,150,000 THEREFOR, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,900,000 BONDS OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR FINANCING SUCH APPROPRIATION.

11 THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The improvement described in Section 3 of this ordinance is hereby authorized as a general improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey. For the said improvement or purpose stated in said Section 3, there is hereby appropriated the sum of \$4,150,000, including the sum of \$250,000 expected to be received by the Township, from the United States of America in cash, labor or materials as a contribution in aid of financing said improvement or purpose.

Section 2. For the financing of said improvement or purpose and to meet the part of said \$4,150,000 appropriation not provided for by application hereunder of the said \$250,000 contribution expected from the United States of America, negotiable bonds of the Township, each to be known as "Sewer Bond", are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$3,900,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law, constituting sections 40:1-1 to 40:1-88 of the Revised Statutes of New Jersey. In anticipation of the issuance of said bonds and to temporarily finance said improve-

amount not exceeding \$3,900,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Law. To temporarily finance said improvement or purpose and in anticipation of the receipt by the Township of said \$250,000 contribution negotiable notes of the Township in a principal amount not exceeding \$250,000 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to and within the limitations prescribed by said Law. The maximum rate of interest which any of said obligations shall bear is six per centum (6%) per annum.

Section 3. The improvement hereby authorized and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued is the improvement and enlargement of the sewerage system of the Township by the construction and installation in and for the Township of the following sewage collection, treatment and disposal facilities: (A) New sewage treatment plant located on the westerly side of River Road approximately on the line of 72nd Street extended eastwardly, together with outfall sewer extending therefrom eastwardly to the Hudson River and sludge pumping station with cast-iron sludge force main extending therefrom northwardly to Hudson Boulevard East and thence in Hudson Boulevard East northwardly to 79th Street and thence in 79th Street westwardly to a connection with the existing sewer in Bergenline Avenue; (B) Intercepting sewer extending in Hudson Boulevard East from 72nd Street northwardly to 74th Street and thence first eastwardly and then southwardly to said new sewage treatment plant located on the westerly side of River Road, with sewage regulating chambers and related equipment and connections located in or near said Hudson Boulevard East (1) at 72nd Street, and (2) at 74th Street; (C) Sewage intercepting mains and structures located at or near the intersection of River Road and Riverside Place providing for the

diversion and disposal of sewage from the existing River Road and Riverside Place sewers; (D) Trunk sewer in Secaucus Road extending from the boundary of Secaucus southeastwardly to a connection with the existing trunk sewer in Dell Avenue, with sewage regulating chamber and related equipment and connections located in or near said Secaucus Road; (E) Gravity discharge sewer line in the Paterson Plank Road extending from the existing cast-iron discharge line southerly of 14th Street northwardly to a connection with the existing trunk sewer in 34th Street; (F) Intercepting sewer extending in the Township's right-of-way on or along the westerly side of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad between the line of 41st Street extended westwardly and a connection with the Central Sewage Treatment Plant of the Township situate on the northerly side of 43rd Street; (G) Intercepting sewer extending in West Side Avenue from 51st Street southwardly to a connection with said Central Sewage Treatment Plant, with sewage regulating chamber and related equipment and connections located at or near 50th Street; (H) Trunk sewer in Granton Avenue extending from the existing sewer at Meadowview Avenue northwestwardly to a connection with the existing trunk sewer in Tonnelle Avenue at or near 69th Street; (I) Sewage pumping station in 69th Street at the easterly side of the New York Central Railroad and sewage force main extending therefrom eastwardly in 69th Street to a connection with the existing trunk sewer in Tonnelle Avenue at or near 69th Street, including sewers tributary thereto extending (1) from the intersection of Nolan Avenue and 70th Street and (2) from the intersection of Tonnelle Avenue and 69th Street, and with sewage regulating chamber and related equipment and connections located in 69th Street; (J) Sewage

pumping station situate at the westerly side of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad approximately in the line of 83rd Street extended westwardly, with cast-iron discharge line eastwardly in 83rd Street to a connection with the existing trunk sewer in 83rd Street easterly of the Erie Railroad; (K) Trunk sewer beginning at a point located approximately 1615 feet westerly of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad and approximately in the line of 83rd Street extended westwardly and running thence eastwardly to said sewage pumping station situate at the westerly side of said Railroad; (L) Sewage pumping station on the site of the Northern Sewage Treatment Plant of the Township situate on the southerly side of 91st Street, and trunk or other sewers extending to said sewage pumping station (1) from Tonnelle Avenue through 91st Street, (2) from the site of the existing sewage pumping station located northerly of the north end of Mazzoni Place northwardly to 89th Street and thence westwardly through 89th Street, and (3) from the northerly side of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad in Railroad Avenue northeastwardly to the westerly side of the Erie Railroad and thence southwardly along said side of said Railroad to 91st Street and thence eastwardly to and through 91st Street; (M) Sewers extending (1) from a point on or near the westerly side of the Erie Railroad approximately 1250 feet south of 91st Street in a northwardly direction to 91st Street, (2) in 88th Street from a point approximately 150 feet west of Tonnelle Avenue westwardly approximately to the line of Mazzoni Place extended northwardly, (3) in 88th Street from the easterly side of the Erie Railroad eastwardly approximately to the line of Mazzoni Place extended northwardly, (4) in 89th Street from Tonnelle Avenue westwardly approximately to the line

line of Mazzonei Place extended northwardly, (6) from a point in 94th Street near Railroad Avenue northwestwardly in 94th Street to Fairview Avenue and thence northeastwardly in Fairview Avenue to 95th Street and thence in 95th Street southwardly to Railroad Avenue, (7) in Nolan Avenue from 90th Street northwardly to 91st Street, (8) in Polk Street from the boundary of Guttenberg northwardly to 72nd Street and thence in 72nd Street eastwardly to Bergenline Avenue, (9) in Madison Street from the boundary of Guttenberg northwardly to 72nd Street, (10) in 89th Street from Durham Avenue westwardly to Grand Avenue and thence in Grand Avenue northwardly to 90th Street, (11) in Columbia Avenue from 90th Street northwardly to 91st Street, (12) in 91st Street from 3rd Avenue westwardly to Hudson Boulevard, (13) in Smith Avenue from 91st Street northwardly to the Township right-of-way at the boundary of Fairview and thence in said right-of-way westwardly to Durham Avenue, (14) in Liberty Avenue from 84th Street northwardly to 86th Street, (15) in 70th Street from Durham Avenue westwardly to Newkirk Avenue and thence in Newkirk Avenue northwardly to 72nd Street, (16) in Dell Avenue from Union Turnpike northwardly for a distance of approximately 200 feet, and (17) in 29th Street from Tonnelle Avenue westwardly to the westerly side of the New York, Susquehanna & Western Railroad; (N) Sewage regulating chambers, with necessary connections and related equipment, located (1) in 29th Street west of Tonnelle Avenue, (2) at or near the intersection of 5th Street and Grand Avenue, (3) in Liberty Avenue approximately 300 feet north of 10th Street, (4) at or near the intersection of 51st Street and Tonnelle Avenue, (5) in Tonnelle Avenue approximately 300 feet north of 10th Street, and (6) at or near the intersection of 91st Street and Tonnelle Avenue; (O) New and addi-



sewage pumping station located on Hillcrest Place east of Palisade Avenue and (2) the Tonnelle Avenue sewage pumping station located on the easterly side of Tonnelle Avenue north of 60th Street; and (P) Storm-water outlet facilities for the Northern Sewage Treatment Plant of the Township situate on the southerly side of 91st Street consisting of a sewage regulating chamber and related equipment and connections, outfall line extending northwardly across 91st Street to Bellmans Creek, and deepening, dredging and other improvement of Bellmans Creek downstream to a point approximately 350 feet southerly of Railroad Avenue; together, in each case, with all necessary connections, valves, manholes, equipment and structures incidental thereto and acquisition of all lands and rights-of-way necessary therefor, and all in accordance with and to the extent described in the Order of the State Department of Health of the State of New Jersey hereinafter mentioned and all as shown on and in accordance with the blueprints and specifications referred to in said Order and on file in the office of the Township Clerk and hereby approved.

Section 4. The following matters are hereby determined, declared, recited and stated:

(a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and no part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.

(b) The estimated maximum amount of bonds or notes to be issued for said purpose is \$4,150,000, of which \$250,000 is the amount of notes of the Township to be issued in anticipation of the receipt of the said \$250,000 contribution expected from the

(c) The estimated maximum amount of money to be raised from all sources for said purpose is \$4,150,000.

(d) The period of usefulness of said purpose, within the limitations of sections 40:1-34 to 40:1-36 of said Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life thereof, is thirty-five (35) years.

(e) The supplemental debt statement required by said Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed original thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in section 40:1-76 of said Law is increased by this ordinance by \$4,150,000, and the issuance of the said obligations authorized by this ordinance is permitted by the exception contained in subsection (g) of section 40:1-16 of said Law to the debt limitations prescribed by said Law.

(f) The following items, as defined and authorized by section 40:1-55 of said Law, are and shall be charged as a part of the cost of said purpose to be financed by the issuance of said obligations: (1) not exceeding \$ 40,000 on account of the cost of issuance of said obligations; and (2) not exceeding \$260,000 on account of engineering and inspection costs and legal expenses; and (3) not exceeding \$ 390,000 on account of interest on obligations to finance such cost during the period permitted by said section.

(g) This ordinance authorizes obligations of the Township solely for a purpose described in subsection (g) of section 40:1-16 of said Law, and the expenditure authorized by this ordinance and every part thereof is necessary to protect the public health

of sufficient gravity to justify the incurrence of debt in excess of statutory limitations and no less expensive method of preventing or suppressing such menace exists, and the State Department of Health of the State of New Jersey has heretofore made findings and an Order to this effect.

Section 5. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this ordinance. Said obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage, as provided by said Local Bond Law.
