Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson and State of New Jersey as follows:

Section 1: That Clement Street, from the Northernly line of Marks Place, (as extended to Valley Road) to the dividing line between the Township of North Bergen and the Borough of Cliffside Park, which said street was dedicated by a certain map entitled, "Map C of property belonging to the estate of David C. Dyer Deceased November 1910", and filed in the office of the Register of Hudson County as Map 2464, do, and the same is hereby vacated as a public street and all public easements and public rights in the same except only storm-water drainage, be and the same are hereby surrendered and extinguished.

Section 2: That all ordinances or parts of ordinance which are in conflict with this ordinance or any part thereof are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

Section 3: That this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE LIMITING AND RESTRICTING TO SPECIFIED DISTRICTS AND REGULATING THEREIN BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES ACCORDING TO THEIR CONSTRUCTION AND THE NATURE AND EXTENT OF THEIR USE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, AND PROVIDING FOR THE ADMINISTRATION AND ENFORCEMENT OF THE PROVISIONS HEREIN CONTAINED AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: That the Use District Map of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, of an ordinance entitled as above, be and the same is hereby amended as follows:

Section 2: That Section XI par. 1 of an ordinance entitled as above be amended to read as follows:

Par. 1. Lots intended for dwellings, business or industrial use shall be provided with off-street delivery facilities and off-street parking in the following minimum ratio, which shall not be subsequently reduced to the applicant, subsequent owners or lessee below the requirements hereinafter set forth.

Par. 1. Section 3 add

Par. 1. Section 4

For any building or premises used for commercial or industrial purposes, indoor or outdoor space for loading and unloading of goods and materials shall be provided on the premises, whenever the aggregate area used for such purposes is 5,000 square feet or more, in accordance with the following schedule:

- (a) 5,000 to 20,000 square feet one space
- (b) 20,000 to 40,000 square feet, two spaces
- (c) Over 40,000 square feet, three spaces

Section 3: That Section XIV par. 1 of an ordinance entitled above be amended to read as follows:

Par. 1A The administration and enforcement of this ordinance is hereby vested in the Engineering Department of the Township of North Bergen.

Par. 1B The Township Engineer, or Assistant Township Engineer shall be empowered to grant minor modifications of any section of this ordinance, provided such modification does not weaken the construction or materially change the intent or purpose of this ordinance, and further provided that the recommendation for the making of said modification be presented in writing to the Engineer to the Board of Adjustment, which Board shall affirm or deny said modification according to procedures required by law for variances or exceptions. Said modification standards to be not more than 20% of any distance, unit, space or area.

Section 4: That Section XIV par. 4 of the ordinance entitled as above amended to read as follows:

No land nor any building or existing building nor any building which harbors a non-conforming use shall hereafter be substantially altered, changed, extended or erected, nor shall any building or any land hereafter be occupied used in whole or in part for any purpose whatsoever, until a certificate of occupancy shall have been issued by the Building Inspector stating that the premises or building or the use thereof complies with all the provisions of this ordinance and any variance or exception granted.

Section 5: Upon final passage of this ordinance, the Township Engineering Department shall be directed to update the Use District Map, including Zoning, Boundary and Street Changes.

Section 6: If any paragraph section or item of this ordinance shall be judged invalid, such adjudication shall apply only to the paragraph section item so adjudged, and other paragraphs, sections or items shall remain valid and effective.

Section 7: This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its final passage and publication as required by law.

Section 2. There is hereby authorized to be appropriated
from the Capital Improvement Fund of the Township of North Bergen
the sum of Twelve thousand dollars (\$12,000.00) for the purpose
authorized by Section 1 of this ordinance.

Section 3. That the said appropriation be charged to the
current Capital Improvement Fund and shall not be deemed to con-
stitute a new debt of the Township but is solely for the purpose of
using said Capital Improvement Fund for the purpose described in
Section 1 herein.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen
in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. The street grades and relative widths of paved and sidewalk areas of the northerly lines of West Side Avenue from Paterson Plank Road to the southerly line of 43rd Street, be and the same are hereby established at the various rates of grades and distances as shown on the plans entitled, "Grade map for the Improvement of West Side Avenue and relative width of paved and sidewalk areas, from the northerly line of Paterson Plank Road to the southerly line of 43rd Street, Township of North Bergen, Hudson County, N.J. February 8, 1965, Joshua Mass, Township Engineer" and filed in the office of the Clerk of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A CODE REGULATING
THE EMISSION OF SMOKE PROVIDING FOR INSPECTION
OF FUEL-BURNING EQUIPMENT AND FIXING PENALTIES
FOR VIOLATIONS.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN
IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. A code regulating the emission of smoke from fuel-burning equipment, internal combustion engines, open fires, stacks or chimneys, and providing for the inspection of fuel-burning equipment, is hereby established pursuant to the Public Health and Sanitation Codes Adoption by Reference Act. (L 1950 c 188) A copy of said code is annexed hereto and made a part hereof without the inclusion of the text thereof herein.

Section 2. The said code established and adopted by this ordinance is described and commonly known as the "Smoke Control Code of New Jersey (1953)".

Section 3. Three copies of the said "Smoke Control Code of New Jersey (1953)" have been placed on file in the Office of the Clerk of the Township of North Bergen upon the introduction of this ordinance and will remain there for the use and examination by the public so long as this ordinance is in effect.

Section 4. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance or code established herein or any order made pursuant thereto or who shall refuse to comply with any such order shall, upon conviction thereof, be liable to a penalty of no more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00) for each violation.

Section 5. In the event that any section, sentence or clause of this ordinance or code shall be declared invalid by a court of competent jurisdiction such declaration shall not in any manner prejudice the enforcement of the remaining provisions.

Section 6. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption and publication as required by law.

WHEREAS there is sufficient moneys in the capital improve-
ment account of the Township of North Bergen for the purpose here-
inafter set forth;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the Township
of North Bergen in the County of Hudson do ordain:

Section 1. That the sum of \$50,000 from the Capital Improve-
ment Fund is hereby appropriated for the purchase of Triple Combustion
Pumper \$35,000 and Ambulance \$15,000 for the use of the Department
of Public Safety of the Township of North Bergen.

Section 2. That the said appropriation of the said Capital
Improvement Fund shall be deemed not to constitute a new debt of the
Township but is solely for the purpose of using said Capital Improve-
ment Fund for the purchase of the Triple Combustion Pumper and Ambulance
as aforesaid.

Section 3. This ordinance shall take effect upon passage
and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE HOSPITAL, MEDICAL,
SURGICAL AND MAJOR MEDICAL-SURGICAL BENEFITS
FOR THE EMPLOYEES OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH
BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON.

* * * * *

WHEREAS this Board did on April 21, 1965 adopt a resolution authorizing the execution of an agreement with the Travelers Insurance Company of Hartford, Connecticut for Health, Hospitalization, Medical, Surgical and Accident Insurance in connection with Major Medical Expense benefits, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 259 of the Laws of 1964; and

WHEREAS provisions have been made in the annual budget for the year 1965 for meeting the costs of such plan for the last half of said year; and

WHEREAS the employees of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, have hitherto formed themselves into groups for the purpose of obtaining a group plan for hospital services, commonly referred to as New Jersey Blue Cross Plan, and the group plan for medical and surgical insurance, commonly referred to as New Jersey Blue Shield Plan; and

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson deem it advisable to take advantage of the authority conferred by Chapter 259 of the Laws of 1964 to enter into a contract with the non-profit hospital and medical service corporations hereinabove referred to, to provide for the coverages heretofore paid for by said employees and coverage for such employees not heretofore included in the group plans above described;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, do ordain:

1. That a contract by the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson with the New Jersey Blue Cross and the New Jersey Blue Shield, is hereby authorized to provide for the payment by the Township of all premiums and charges for the coverages covered by said contracts for all employees of the Township of North Bergen as defined in said Chapter 259 of the Laws of 1964 to begin on and after July 1, 1965, and for such officers and employees who may hereafter become associated with the Township;

2. That the sum of \$30,000.00 is hereby appropriated by the Township out of its general funds for the purpose of paying such premiums and charges for the second half of the calendar year 1965;

3. The said contract shall provide for the continuance of coverage after retirement of any employee for such services, as may be provided, at such rates and under such conditions as are prescribed in the contracts provided;

4. The executive officer of the Township is authorized and directed to execute the contracts herein authorized and shall file 4 executed copies of the same with the State Health Benefits Commission.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED, "AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE CONSTRUCTION, ERECTION, ALTERATION, REPAIR, RAISING, REMOVAL OR DEMOLITION OF ANY BUILDING OR STRUCTURE OR ANY PART OF EITHER TO REGULATE AND CONTROL PUBLIC AND OTHER AUTOMOBILE GARAGES AND THE OPENING OF ANY PORTION OF ANY IMPROVED STREET SURFACE IN THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON" KNOWN AS THE BUILDING CODE.

* * * * *

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson do ordain:

Section 1. That Section 1D, Rear Yards, Paragraph C, Sentence 4 of the Ordinance entitled as above shall be amended to read:

"Where a lot is more than 100 feet deep as shown on the Tax Map of the Township of North Bergen dated October 1, 1954, one third of the additional depth shall be added to the required rear yard".

Section 2. That Section 1E, "Sideyards", Paragraph C, Sentence 3 of the Ordinance entitled as above shall be amended to read:

"For each foot that a lot is less than fifty feet wide as shown on the Tax Map of the Township of North Bergen dated October 1, 1963, six inches shall be deducted from the required sideyards aggregate width at any level".

Section 3. That Section 3, "Building Permits" of the Ordinance entitled as above headed "Street and Sidewalk Openings" shall be amended to read:

"Street and Sidewalk Openings and Removal or Lowering of Curbs Fee for permits for the opening of a street, sidewalk and the removal or lowering of curbing shall be one dollar (\$1.00). Application shall be accompanied by cash or bond in the amount determined by the Township Engineer to be necessary for guaranteeing the proper protection of safety requirements and replacement of such street, sidewalk or curb".

Section 4. That the Ordinance entitled as above shall be amended by adding thereto "Section 1G Lot Coverage - No private or multi-family dwelling shall be erected which will exceed 50% of the area of the parcel on which it is proposed to be erected as measured at either foundation level or the projection of the first story thereof. Exempt from the above shall be stairs, platforms, area ways or garages as described under Section 10 Paragraph C".

Section 5. That Section 24, "Reinforced Concrete", Paragraph E of the ordinance entitled as above shall be amended following the table by adding the wording, - "Updated code requirements issued by the aforementioned institute shall be incorporated as issued by the same".

Section 6. That Section 29, "Working Stresses and Loads", paragraphs D, F and G in the Ordinance entitled as above shall be amended by adding to

"(F) All prefabricated modular masonry units such as brick, etc. delivered to a building site shall be accompanied by a certificate from a testing laboratory certified to do business in the State of New Jersey indicating the source of the material, description of the same, compressive strength, fire rating, absorption and other properties as specified by the ASTM to enable the Building Inspector to determine the suitability of the material for the purposes intended.

"(G) All wood beams, joists, studs and sheathing delivered to the building site shall be accompanied by a delivery ticket which shall indicate the type of wood, grade and size which delivery ticket shall be available for the inspection by the Building Inspector at the time the rough framing is inspected".

Section 7. That Section 7 "Loads", paragraph G shall be amended to read as follows:

"G Flat and Pitched Roofs - Ordinary roofs, either flat, curved or pitched shall be designed to safely support a dead load of not less than 20 pounds per square foot of horizontal projection, and in addition thereto to safely support water, snow, ice and wind loads to which such roofs may be subjected. Such ordinary roofs shall be designed to safely support a live load of not less than 30 pounds per square foot of horizontal projection.

When the effect of the shape of the roof structure as determined by study or actual test indicates greater or lesser water, snow or ice retention than specified herein, the roof loading shall be modified accordingly.

When used for incidental promenade purposes, roofs shall be designed for a minimum live load of 60 pounds per square foot, and 100 pounds per square foot when the roof is to be used as a roof garden or for assembly purposes".

Section 8. That Section 31, "Loads" of an ordinance entitled as above be amended by adding thereto the following:

"M 1 "Wind Loads" - Buildings and other structures shall be designed and constructed to withstand the horizontal pressures shown in the following table, allowing for the wind from any direction. The height is to be measured above the average level of the ground adjacent to the building or structure. Allowance is to be made for the shielding effect of other buildings or structures unless approved by the Building Inspector.

"M 4 Wind Load on Walls - On walls under 50 feet high wind loads may generally be neglected except where the height exceeds four times the width at minimum section or when inadequate transverse bracing is provided, and except for roof anchorage for roof to walls, roof to foundation and for the design of overhanging eaves, cornices and other projections."

"M 5 Distribution of Wind Force - The wind force shall be distributed 2/3 to the windward and 1/3 outward on the leeward.

"M 5 Allowance for Windows - On ordinary windows exceeding 1/3 of wall space, inward wind force of 10 pounds per square foot shall be deemed to occur simultaneously with the above forces both in pressure and suction."

"M 6 - Anchorage of Roofs and Walls - Roof framing shall be anchored to wall framing and walls to foundations so as to resist uplift and sliding in excess of 2/3 of the dead load resistance."

"M 7 Uplift on Eaves and Cornices - Overhanging eaves, cornices and other wall and roof projections shall be designed and constructed to withstand an upward pressure of 40 pounds per square foot.

"M 8 Ground Signs and Towers - The wind pressure on signs and towers shall be assumed at 30 pounds per square foot of the net exposed area of the structure normal to the wind for structures up to 50 feet in height and 40 pounds for structures over 50 feet in height.

"M 9 Roof Structures - The wind pressure on roof signs, tank towers, stacks, chimneys and other exposed roof structures with plane surfaces shall be assumed at 30 pounds per square foot applied to the net projected area of the structure normal to the wind except for such corrections as may be required for shielding effect and effect of shape.

"M 10 Radio and Television Towers - All radio and television towers shall be designed to resist a wind of not less than 30 pounds per square foot area of both sides of latticed construction and on the projected area of the antenna plus the wind on ice covered section. Where winds of unusual velocity may occur the loads shall be increased accordingly. Adequate foundations shall be provided to resist twice the calculated wind uplift. Antenna and towers shall be designed for dead load plus ice load".

Section 9. That Section 53, "Soil Bearing Capacity" of the Ordinance described as above be amended by adding thereto the following:

"Where underlying soil strata are incapable of supporting superimposed loads by standard footings or piling but are capable of compaction by means of the application of compacted selected fill and accelerating the period required by surcharge and drainage under the supervision of certified soil experts licensed to practice engineering in the State of New Jersey, the loading allowances in the above table may be modified by the building inspector, provided, however, that such fill shall not incorporate rock, rubble, building materials, or other deleterious material."

Section 11. If for any reason any provision or sections of this ordinance shall be held to be illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect any section or provision of this ordinance except so far as the section or provision so declared illegal or invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

Section 12. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

Section 13. This ordinance shall take effect upon adoption and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AN ELECTRICAL CODE FOR THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, PRESCRIBING REGULATIONS GOVERNING CONDITIONS HAZARDOUS, TO LIFE AND PROPERTY FROM ELECTRICAL FIRE OR EXPLOSIONS AND ESTABLISHING AN ELECTRICAL INSPECTION DIVISION IN THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS, AND PROVIDING OFFICERS THEREFOR, DEFINING THEIR POWERS, DUTIES, ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF FEES AND PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, N.J. DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Title: This ordinance shall be known as "The Electrical Code of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson."

Section 1A. Definitions: (A) Inspector means Inspector of Electrical work appointed under the provisions of this ordinance.

Section 1B. Purpose: An Electrical Code is hereby adopted for the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson prescribing regulations governing conditions hazardous to life and property from electrical fire or explosion; establishing an Electrical Inspection Department in the Department of Public Works and officers thereof; defining their powers, duties and fees; and fixing penalties for the violations thereof.

Section 2: That said code shall include as part of this ordinance, a code printed in book form entitled "National Electrical Code—Edition of 1962—recommended by the National Board of Fire Underwriters" hereinafter referred to as the National Electrical Code or to such updated edition as may from time to time be adopted.

Section 3: Three (3) copies of the said National Electrical Code, which are annexed to this ordinance and made a part hereof, have been placed in the office of the Township Clerk, in the Municipal Building, 4233 Kennedy Blvd., North Bergen, N. J. and will remain on file for the use and examination by the public; and (3) additional copies shall be placed on file in the office of the Director of Public Works, so long as the ordinance is in effect, for the use and examination of the public.

Section 4: Where the word "Municipality" is used in National Fire Prevention Code and the National Electrical Code, it shall be held to mean the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson.

Section 5: (A) Any person who shall violate any of the provisions of the code hereby adopted or fail to comply therewith, or who shall violate or fail to comply with any order made thereunder, or who shall build in violation of any detailed statement of specifications or plans submitted and approved thereunder, or any certificate or permit issued thereunder and from which no appeal has been taken, or who shall fail to comply with such an order as affirmed or modified by a court of competent jurisdiction, within the time fixed herein, shall severally for each and every such violation and non-compliance respectively be guilty of a misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of not more than \$200.00 or by imprisonment for not more than 30 days, or by both such fines and imprisonment. The imposition of one penalty for any violation shall not excuse the violation or permit it to continue; and all such persons shall be required to correct or remedy such violations or defects within a reasonable time; and when not otherwise specified, each 10 days

that prohibited conditions are maintained shall constitute a separate offense.

(B) The application of the above penalty shall not be held to prevent the enforced removal of prohibited conditions.

Section 6: That a schedule of permit fees be established as follows:

1. Any person claiming payment from the municipality shall present a detailed bill of demand to the purchasing agent or supervisor of accounts, duly certified.
2. It shall be the duty of the Director of the Department of Revenue and Finance or supervisor of accounts to see that the signature of the officer or employee, who has been duly designated by the local unit to certify that the materials have been received by or the services rendered to the local unit, appears on every claim.
3. Claims shall then be presented to the director of the department responsible for the placing of the order who, if satisfied the claims are proper, shall approve the same. After such approval is given, the director shall file the claims with the municipal clerk who shall then present these claims to the governing body for formal approval at a regular meeting.
4. Claims shall be considered by the governing body which shall approve the same, except that said governing body may reject any claim presented to it stating the reasons for such reject. Any disapproved claim shall be referred back to the municipal clerk with such instructions as the governing body may give at the time of disapproval.
5. It shall be the duty of the municipal clerk to record all claims in the official minutes indicating that the governing body has by formal action approved the same with appropriate record as to any claims disapproved or rejected.
6. It shall be the duty of the municipal clerk or such other officer designated by resolution of the governing body, to indicate on said claims that they have been approved for payment with the date of approval thereof noted on the claim.
7. After the clerk has certified that the claims have been approved, he shall turn the same over to the supervisor of accounts or other chief financial officer, who shall forthwith prepare the necessary checks for the payment thereof, which said checks shall be signed by the Director of the Department of Revenue and Finance and the municipal clerk and thereafter countersigned by the supervisor of accounts or other chief financial officer. After preparing checks for the payment of claims, such chief financial officer shall record them in proper books of account and thereafter mail or otherwise distribute the checks to the claimants.

AN ORDINANCE ACCEPTING AND ADOPTING THE "NEW JERSEY STATE HOUSING CODE" AS A STANDARD COVERING SUPPLIED UTILITIES AND FACILITIES AND OTHER PHYSICAL THINGS AND CONDITIONS ESSENTIAL TO MAKING DWELLINGS SAFE, SANITARY AND FIT FOR HUMAN HABITATION AND GOVERNING THE CONDITION OF DWELLINGS, AUTHORIZING INSPECTION OF DWELLINGS AND FIXING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson do ordain that:

- 1. The Township Engineer of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson be and he is hereby designated as the officer to exercise the powers prescribed by the within ordinance, and he shall serve in such capacity without any additional salary.**
- 2. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 21, P.L. 1946 (N.J.S.A. 40:49-3.1) the "New Jersey State Housing Code" as approved by the Departments of Health and Conservation and Economic Development and filed in the Secretary of State's office is hereby accepted, adopted and established as a standard to be used as a guide in determining whether dwellings in this municipality are safe, sanitary and fit for human habitation and rental. A copy of the "New Jersey State Housing Code" is annexed to this ordinance and three copies of the same have been placed on file in the office of the Township Clerk and are available to all persons desiring to use and examine the same.**
- 3. The Township Engineer is hereby authorized and directed to make inspections to determine the condition of dwellings, dwelling units, rooming units, and premises located within the Township of North Bergen in order that he may perform his duty of safeguarding the health and safety of the occupants of dwellings and of the general public. For the purpose of making such inspections the Township Engineer is hereby authorized to enter, examine and survey at all reasonable times all dwellings, dwelling units, rooming units, and premises. The owner or occupant of every dwelling, dwelling unit, and rooming unit, or the person in charge thereof, shall give the Township Engineer, his assistants or deputies, free access to such dwelling, dwelling unit or rooming unit and its premises at all reasonable times for the purpose of such inspection, examination and survey. Every occupant of a dwelling or dwelling unit shall give the owner thereof, or his agent or employee, access to any part of such dwelling or dwelling unit, or its premises, at all reasonable times for the purpose of making such repairs or alterations as are necessary to effect compliance with the provisions of this ordinance or with any lawful rule or regulation adopted or any lawful order issued pursuant to the provisions of this ordinance.**
- 4. Whenever the Township Engineer determines that there are reasonable grounds to believe that there has been a violation of any provision of this ordinance, or of any rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto, he shall give notice of such alleged violation to the person or persons responsible therefor as hereinafter provided. Such notice shall (a) be**

of remedial action which, if taken, will affect compliance with the provisions of this ordinance and with rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto.

Any person affected by any notice which has been issued in connection with the enforcement of any provision of this ordinance, or of any rule or regulation adopted pursuant thereto, may request and shall be granted a hearing on the matter before the Director of Public Works, provided such person shall file in the office of the said Director a written petition requesting such hearing and setting forth a brief statement of the grounds therefor within ten days after the day the notice was served. Upon receipt of such petition the said Director shall set a time and place for such hearing and shall give the petitioner written notice thereof. At such hearing the petitioner shall be given an opportunity to be heard and to show why such notice should be modified or withdrawn. The hearing shall be commenced not later than ten days after the day on which the petition was filed; provided that upon application of the petitioner the said Director may postpone the date of the hearing for a reasonable time beyond such 10-day period, if in his judgment the petitioner has submitted a good and sufficient reason for such postponement. After such hearing the said Director shall sustain, modify, or withdraw the notice, depending upon his findings as to whether the provisions of this ordinance and of the rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto have been complied with. If the Director of Public Works sustains or modifies such notice, it shall be deemed to be an order. Any notice served pursuant to this ordinance shall automatically become an order if a written petition for a hearing is not filed in the office of the said Director within ten days after such notice is served. The proceedings at such hearing, including the findings and decision of the said Director shall be summarized, reduced to writing, and entered as a matter of public record in the office of the Township Engineer. Such record shall also include a copy of every notice or order issued in connection with the matter. Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Director of Public Works may seek relief therefrom in any court of competent jurisdiction, as provided by the laws of the state. Whenever the said Director finds that an emergency exists which requires immediate action to protect the public health, or safety, he may, without notice or hearing, issue an order reciting the existence of such an emergency and requiring that such action be taken as he deems necessary to meet the emergency. Notwithstanding the other provisions of this ordinance, such order shall be effective immediately. Any person to whom such order is directed shall comply therewith immediately, but upon petition to the Director of Public Works shall be afforded a hearing as soon as possible. After such hearing, depending upon his findings as to whether the provisions of this ordinance and of the rules and regulations adopted pursuant thereto have been complied with, the said Director shall continue such order in effect, or modify it, or revoke it.

5. The Director of Public Works is hereby authorized and empowered to make and adopt such written rules and regulations as he may deem necessary for the proper enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance, provided, however, that such rules and regulations shall not be in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, nor in anywise

6. No person shall occupy as owner occupant or rent to another for occupancy any dwelling or dwelling unit for the purpose of living therein which does not conform to the provisions of the "New Jersey State Housing Code" established hereby as the standard to be used in determining whether a dwelling is safe, sanitary and fit for human habitation.

7. Any person, firm or corporation who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) or by imprisonment in the county jail for a period of not to exceed ninety (90) days or by both such fine and imprisonment, and each violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance and each day the same is violated shall be deemed and taken to be a separate and distinct offense.

8. All other ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict or inconsistent with this ordinance are hereby repealed, but only to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency, and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect immediately upon its adoption and its publication, as provided by law.

9. Should any section, paragraph, sentence, clause or phrase of this ordinance be declared unconstitutional or invalid for any reason, the remaining portions of this ordinance shall not be affected thereby and shall remain in full force and effect, and to this end the provisions of this ordinance are hereby declared to be severable.
