THE CFOUNTY OF HUDSON

WHEREAS, the use of guns, pistols and other firearms in the Township of North Bergen in the pursuit of game located in said Township and like activities has, on occasion, inflicted serious wounds on the persons in said Township and constitutes a danger to the life and property of the inhabitants thereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of commissioners of the township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1: The use of guns, pistols and firearms of all descriptions is hereby prohibited in the Township of North Bergen in the counn of Hudson provided however, that this prohibition shall not apply to a practice pistol range in use by members of a regularly constituted police department, nor to a properly constructed and operated indoor or outdoor rifle range, nor to the use of such instrumentalities in the lawful defense of persons or property.

SECTION 2. Any person found gulity of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$100.00 or imprisonment in the county Jail for a term not exceeding ten days or both such fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published, as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE ROUSTEIN AVENUE
FROM THE NORTHERLY LINE OF 70TH STREET
TO ITS NORTHERLY TERMINUS.

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson did, by virtue of an ordinance adopted May 23, 1941, dedicate for use as a public street, Roustein Avenue from the northerly line of 69th Street, 685.98' to its northerly terminus, and

WHEREAS the northerly 372.54' of that portion of Roustein Avenue lying northerly of the northerly line of 70th Street has never been used as a public street, is ungraded and is not required for any municipal purposes;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: That the portion of Roustein Avenue extending from the northerly line of 70th Street, 372.54' to its northerly terminus be and the same is hereby vacated as a public street.

Section 2: That all ordinances which are in conflict with this ordinance or any part thereof are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions.

Section 3: That this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE SALE, EXHIBITION
OR DISTRIBUTION OF OBSCENE, INDECENT AND IMMORAL
LITERATURE, FILMS AND OTHER MATERIAL.

WHEREAS the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen deems that the sale, exhibition or distribution of literature, or any printed material containing obscene, lewd, immoral or otherwise indecent language, prints, pictures, figures or representations, manifestly tend to corrupt the morals, health, welfare and well-being of the citizens of North Bergen:

THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN COUNTY OF HUDSON DO ORDAIN:

1. It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to have in his, her or its possession or control for sale, exhibition or distribution, or to sell or offer to sell, exhibit, give away, distribute upon or within any street, alley, park, school building or room, hall theater, show house, newsstand, store or other place of business or any entertainment, any book, pamphlet, paper, films, or other thing containing obscene, lewd, immoral or otherwise indecent language, prints, pictures, figures or representations, and manifestly tending to the corruption of morals.

2. Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of a violation of this ordinance shall be punished by the payment of a fine of not more than TWO HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$200.), or imprisonment in the County Jail for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days, or both.

Recital

Pursuant to due action of the Board of Education of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, taken at and pursuant to its meeting duly held on June 11, 1959, and due action of the Board of School Estimate of the Township, taken at and pursuant to its meeting duly held June 11, 1959, the sum of \$4,550,000. has been estimated, fixed and determined as the amount of money necessary for the school improvement or purpose described in Section 1 of the ordinance set forth below, all as more fully appears by the certificate heretofore made by said Board of School Estimate and delivered to this Board of Commissioners. No part of said amount has been appropriated by this Board of Commissioners and no part of said amount has been raised and paid to the Custodian of School Moneys.

ORDINANCE

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Pursuant to the provisions of Title 18 of the Revised Statutes of the State of New Jersey, particularly Article 8 of Chapter 6 of said Title and any other laws applicable thereto, there is hereby appropriated for the school improvement or purpose hereinbelow described the sum of money hereinbelow stated:

<u>School Improvement or Purpose</u>	<u>Amount</u>
Acquisition of lands by gift, grant, purchase or condemnation, for use for school purposes, located in the Township on the southwesterly corner of Hudson Boulevard and 76th Street and designated as Lots 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7A, 7B, Plots 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 in Block 263 and Lot 13 in Block 324, as shown on the Tax Map of said Township, the construction on said land of a new high school and an administration building, the furnishing and equipping of said high school and administration building and the improvement of the sites thereof	\$4,550,000.00

Section 2. The said sum so appropriated for such improvement or purpose shall be borrowed, and said appropriation shall be met from the proceeds of sale of bonds of the Township, which are hereby authorized to be

Section 4. This Board of Commissioners being the governing body of the Township, hereby concurs in and consents to the said appropriation and in and to the issuance of said bonds.

Section 5. It is hereby determined that the period within which said bonds shall mature, being the period assigned by Section 18:6-66 of said Revised Statutes to the purpose for which said bonds are to be issued, is forty (40) years.

Section 6. The authorization of the \$4,550,000. bonds provided for by this ordinance uses up none of the borrowing margin of the Township previously available for other improvements.

Section 7. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds. Said bonds shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said bonds and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 8. This ordinance shall take effect at the expiration of ten days from the date of its publication after final passage as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE SPECIAL TRAFFIC CONDITIONS EXISTING UPON THE STREETS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, SETTING PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PORTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH", ADOPTED SEPTEMBER 2, 1953.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, do ordain:

Section 1. That section 10.04 of the ordinance entitled as above is amended to read as follows:

10.04 Parking meters installed in the parking zones established as aforesaid shall be placed upon the curb immediately adjacent to the parking spaces herein described. Each parking meter shall show or display by signal that the parking space adjacent to such meter is or is not legally in use. It shall show or display a signal indicating legal parking upon a coin of the United States being deposited. Directions concerning the operation of said meters shall plainly appear thereon. Upon the deposit of one penny such signal shall indicate legal parking for a period of 12 minutes, two pennies, 24 minutes, 3 pennies, 36 minutes, 4 pennies, 48 minutes, 5 pennies or one nickel, 60 minutes, and two nickels, 120 minutes. A clock like device with a pointer thereon shall indicate on a dial the time remaining for legal parking. Upon the expiration of any of the periods above set forth, the said meter shall indicate by a proper visible signal that the lawful parking period has expired and in such cases the right of such vehicle to occupy such space shall cease and unless such vehicle is removed, the owner or operator thereof shall be subject to the penalties hereinafter provided.

Section 2. That Section 10.05 of the ordinance entitled as above is amended to read as follows:

10.05 When any vehicle shall be parked in a space adjacent to which a parking meter is located in accordance with this ordinance, the operator of said vehicle shall, upon entering said parking space, immediately deposit or cause to be deposited in the parking meter nearest the front of said vehicle a coin of the United States, one cent for each 12 minutes that he intends to park, and a five cent coin for each period of 60 minutes. Should such operator desire such vehicle to be parked for a further length of time, he shall deposit such additional coin or coins as may coincide with his intention. Upon having so deposited said coin or coins, the said vehicle may lawfully occupy said parking space for the time indicated by said parking meter, provided, however, that the said operator shall not suffer said vehicle to be parked

Section 3. All ordinances or parts of ordinances inconsistent herewith are repealed as to the inconsistent parts thereof.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect after its adoption and publication as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE CREATING THE MEADOWLANDS
REGIONAL DEVELOPMENT AGENCY.

* * * * *

WHEREAS there exists in the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson an area or areas commonly called "meadowlands," and certain areas immediately adjacent thereto, which are blighted or in the process of becoming blighted in accordance with the criteria set forth in Chapter 306 of New Jersey Sessions Laws of 1949, N.J.S.A. 40:55C-3; and

WHEREAS these areas in the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson should become available for economically and socially sound development by private or public enterprise or by a combination of both; and

WHEREAS it is in the public interest that work on projects to secure such development be commenced as soon as possible; and

WHEREAS the conditions described in N.J.S.A. 40:55C-3 exist in other municipalities on account of the presence therein of meadowlands; and

WHEREAS development of the meadowlands and certain immediately adjacent areas within this municipality can be best facilitated in connection with a comprehensive development plan embracing some or all of the municipalities containing meadowlands;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, do ordain:

1. Pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 306 of New Jersey Sessions Laws of 1949, N.J.S.A. 40:55C-1, et seq., which authorizes the creation of a Regional Development Agency, this Township and the other municipalities passing similar ordinances do agree that there shall be created and they do hereby create a public body corporate and politic to be known as the "Meadowlands Regional Development Agency".

2. The Meadowlands Regional Development Agency herein created shall constitute an instrumentality of this municipality and of any other municipality creating by a similar ordinance the Meadowlands Regional Development Agency.

3. The Clerk be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to file a certified copy of this ordinance with the Commissioner of Conservation and Economic Development of the State of New Jersey.

4. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon final passage and publication according to law.

WHEREAS the division line between the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson and the Town of Secaucus in the County of Hudson for a portion thereof was established as the center line of Penhorn Creek following the several courses thereof to a sluice or culvert under the Paterson Plank Road connecting said creek with the Croskill Creek, all as provided for by an act entitled, "An Act to Incorporate the Borough of Secaucus in the County of Hudson" approved March 12th, 1900, and

Section 1. That the sum of \$48,000.00 from the Capital Improvement Fund is hereby appropriated for the purchase of fire apparatus and equipment for the use of the Department of Public Safety of the Township of North Bergen.

Section 2. That portion of Section 1 of an ordinance entitled "An Ordinance Appropriating the Sum of \$29,000.00 in the Capital Improvement Fund of the Township of North Bergen for Sundry Lawful Purposes", adopted October 1st, 1958, appropriating the sum of \$20,500.00 for the purchase of fire equipment is hereby superseded.

Section 3. That the said appropriation of the said Capital Improvement Fund shall be deemed not to constitute a new debt of the Township but is solely for the purpose of using said Capital Improvement Fund for the purchase of the fire apparatus and equipment as aforesaid.

TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN

AN ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND CONTROL THE SALE AND USE OF PLASTIC COVERINGS OR BAGS; DEFINING THE TERMS EMPLOYED THEREIN; ESTABLISHING AND CREATING A BUREAU OF PLASTICS; CONFERRING POWERS UPON THE SENIOR SANITARIAN; MAKING CERTAIN ACTS UNLAWFUL AND PROVIDING PENALTIES THEREFOR

WHEREAS, it has been brought to the attention of the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen, through the public press, radio and television, that because of the use in certain businesses, of plastic coverings or bags, supplied to its customers, a condition, dangerous to the life and safety of the children of this community, does exist; and

WHEREAS, the absence of proper supervision and regulation of the use of the aforesaid plastic coverings or bags would result in serious danger to the health, safety, life and welfare of the children of the community; and

WHEREAS, a system of supervision and regulation of the use of the aforesaid plastic coverings or bags is vitally necessary in order to protect the life, health, safety and general welfare of the children of the Township of North Bergen; and

WHEREAS, a serious public emergency exists by reason of the uncontrolled use by certain businesses, of plastic coverings or bags in the Township of North Bergen; and

WHEREAS, as a result it has become necessary, for the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen, to invoke its inherent police powers in order to protect the health, safety, life and general welfare of the children of the Township of North Bergen; now therefore,

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen, do ordain:

Section 1. The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen hereby finds, determines and declares:

a. That a serious public emergency exists by reason of the uncontrolled use by certain businesses of plastic coverings or bags in the Township of North Bergen.

b. That the absence of proper supervision, regulations and controls of the aforesaid plastic coverings or bags would result in serious danger to the health, safety, life and welfare of the children of said Township.

c. That to prevent such dangers to health, safety, life and welfare, preventive action by the Board of Commissioners of said Township is imperative.

d. That such supervision, regulations and controls are urgently needed in order to prevent danger to the health

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and include:

"SENIOR SANITARIAN" means the Health Officer of the Health Board of the Township of North Bergen.

"REGULATION AND REGULATIONS" means the administrative directions which shall be promulgated by the Senior Sanitarian from time to time for the purpose of effectuating the terms and conditions of this ordinance.

"PERSON" means any individual, corporation, partnership, association or any other organized group of individuals or the legal successor or representative of any of the foregoing.

"PLASTIC BAG" means a polyethylene bag, other than one used for food products weighing not more than five pounds, intended for household use or for packaging articles intended for household use which is larger than 7 inches in diameter at the opened end, and is made of thin film less than 1 mil (0.001 inch) in thickness.

Section 4. BUREAU OF PLASTICS.

A Bureau of Plastics of the Township of North Bergen is hereby created in the Health Board of the Township of North Bergen, and under the jurisdiction of the Department of Public Affairs. The Bureau shall be headed by the Senior Sanitarian, who shall be assisted by the present personnel of the Health Board, all of whom shall receive no extra compensation for the performance of the duties outlined in this Ordinance.

Section 5. POWERS AND DUTIES OF SENIOR SANITARIAN

The powers and duties of the Senior Sanitarian shall be as follows:

(1) To adequately effectuate the terms and provisions of this ordinance:

(2) For the exercise by him of the function, powers and duties conferred upon him hereunder.

(3) To supervise, control and regulate the use of plastic coverings or bags in the Township of North Bergen, consistent with the purpose of this ordinance, as stated in Section 1 hereof.

(4) The Senior Sanitarian, guided by the consideration of safety to the life of children, shall make such other rules and regulations which may be required to facilitate the administration and enforcement of the provisions of this ordinance with respect to the providing of safeguards to be approved by him, as a condition of granting approval of the use of the said plastic coverings or bags as referred to in this Ordinance.

The warning shall be printed on, attached to, or accompany each bag; provided, however, that it shall be permissible to print the warning on the outside wrapper of packages of bags intended for home processing use only, eg., freezer bags, garbage disposal bags, in lieu of on each individual bag. The warning shall be prominently and conspicuously displayed in bold face type, in accordance with the following table:

Total of the length and width of the bag, combined	Size of Print
60 inches or more 	24 points
40 inches, but less than 60 inches 	18 points
30 inches, but less than 40 inches 	14 points
Less than 30 inches 	10 points

Section 7. Any person who violates any provision of this ordinance, or of any regulation, order or requirement hereunder shall, upon conviction thereof, be punishable by a fine not exceeding Two Hundred (\$200.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment in the County Jail for a term not exceeding ninety (90) days or both, in the discretion of the Magistrate before whom such conviction may be had and such Magistrate is hereby authorized to impose any fine or term of imprisonment not exceeding the maximum hereunder fixed.

Section 8. All ordinances and parts of Ordinances, inconsistent herewith, only to the extent of such inconsistencies are hereby repealed.

Section 9. If at any time hereafter, it shall be determined by a court of competent jurisdiction that any provision or provisions of this Ordinance are unconstitutional or illegal, such findings shall not effect the remaining provisions of this Ordinance, but such remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

Section 10. This Ordinance having been declared by the Governing Body to be of an emergency nature shall become effective immediately.
