Section 1: That Section 2 of the ordinance as above described be amended by adding thereto the following:

"Code requirements as issued by the National Board of Fire Underwriters to the Fire Prevention Code Edition of 1965 shall be updated as revised from time to time by the aforementioned National Board of Fire Underwriters".

Section 2: If for any reason any provision or section of this ordinance shall be held to be illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect any section of provision of this ordinance except so far as the section or provision so declared illegal or invalid shall be inseparable from the remainder or any portion thereof.

"Beginning at a point formed by the intersection of the westerly line of Fairview Avenue now known as Columbia Avenue with the northerly line of lot 76 in township block 208 being distant southerly 150.00 feet from a point formed by the intersection of 64th Street (formerly known as South Street) with the westerly line of Fairview Avenue; thence, (1) S35°-30'W, a distance of 7.00 feet; (2) S-54°-30'E, a distance of 2.00 feet; (3) N 35°-30'E, a distance of 7.00 feet; (4) N-54°-30'W, a distance of 2.00 feet to the point and place of beginning consisting of part of 5 steps and part of a platform stoop encroaching into Columbia Avenue.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE PERMANENT FINANCING OF THE COST OF IMPROVEMENT OF THE SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM IN AND OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY, INCLUDING THE FUNDING AND RETIREMENT OF OUTSTANDING BOND ANTICIPATION NOTES, AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF \$3,400,000 SANITARY SEWER BONDS OF THE TOWNSHIP FOR SUCH PURPOSE.

THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN, IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, NEW JERSEY (not less than two-thirds of all the members thereof affirmatively concurring) DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section l. The improvement described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance has heretofore been authorized as an improvement to be made or acquired by The Township of North Bergen, in the County of Hudson, New Jersey, by the ordinance of the Township heretofore adopted by the governing body of the Township on March 25, 1964, and entitled: "Bond ordinance providing for improvement of the sanitary sewer system in and of The Township of North Bergen $_{ heta}$ in the County of Hudson, New Jersey $_{ heta}$ appropriating \$3,400,000 therefor, and authorizing the issuance of \$3,400,000 bonds or notes of the Township for financing such appropriation", (said ordinance being herein called the "Improvement Ordinance") as aupplemented by the ordinance of the Township heretofore adopted by the governing body thereof on June 17, 1964, making a supplemental appropriation of \$1,615,000 for the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 hereof and authorizing the issuance of \$1,615,000 bonds or notes of the Township for financing such appropriation. To meet the cost of said improvement, estimated June, 1964, at \$5,015,000, there has heretofore been appropriated or made available by the Improvement Ordinance, as supplemented, the sum of \$5,015,000, said sum being inclusive of the estimated amount of \$1,515, 000 expected to be received by the Township as a grant-in-aid of financing said improvement or purpose under or pursuant to the Public Works Acceleration Act (Public Law 87-658 of the 87th Congress of the United States) from the United States of America, or agencies thereof (herein called "Federal Funds").

Section 2. For the permanent financing of said improvement or purpose and for the funding and retirement of bond anticipation notes of the Township authorized or issued pursuant to the Improvement Ordinance, negotiable bonds of the Township, each to be known as "Sanitary Sewer Bond", are hereby authorized to be issued in the principal amount of \$3,400,000 pursuant to the Local Bond Law of New Jersey.

Section 3. (a) The improvement authorized by the Improvement Oxdinance and the purpose for the financing of which said obligations are to be issued including the funding and retirement of bond anticipation notes of the Township heretofore authorized or issued therefor, is the improvement and enlargement of the sanitary sewer system of the Township by the construction and installation of a new force main extending from the Northern Sewage Treatment Plant at 91st Street westerly to Bellman's Creek, thence under the right-of-way of the New York Central and New York Susquehanna and Western Railroad to a point, thence southerly and paxallel to said New York Susquehanna and Western Railroad right-of-way to the Township-Jersey City boundary line, together with all necessary con-

(c) The estimated cost of said purpose is \$5,015,000 inclusive of \$1,615,000 appropriation heretofore made therefor by said supplemental ordinance adopted June 17, 1964.

Section 4. The following matters are hereby determined, declared, recited, and stated:

- (a) The said purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance is not a current expense and is a property or improvement which the Township may lawfully acquire or make as a general improvement, and not part of the cost thereof has been or shall be specially assessed on property specially benefited thereby.
- (b) The period of usefulness of said purpose, within the limitations of said Local Bond Law and according to the reasonable life thereof, is forty (40) years.
- (c) The supplemental debt statement required by said Law has been duly made and filed in the office of the Township Clerk and a complete executed duplicate oxiginal thereof has been filed in the office of the Director of the Division of Local Government in the Department of the Treasury of the State of New Jersey, and such statement shows that the gross debt of the Township as defined in said Law is increased by authorization of the said obligations provided for by this bond ordinance by \$3,400,000 and that the issuance of the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance is permitted by the exception contained in subsection (b) of section 40A:2-7 of said Law to the debt limitations prescribed by said Law.
- (d) The aggregate amount of \$450,000 for items of expense permitted under section 40A:2-20 of said Law, has been included as part of the cost of the improvement or purpose described in Section 3 of this bond ordinance.
- (e) This bond ordinance authorizes obligations of the Township solely for a purpose described in paragraph (b) of section 40A:2-7 of said law.

Section 5. The Improvement Ordinance is hereby superseded and repealed to the extent, but only to the extent, that said ordinance shall be authorized for the issuance of bonds or bond anticipation notes of the Township after the effective date of this ordinance, but nothing herein contained shall affect or impair the validity of any bond anticipation notes or other obligations of the Township heretofore issued or incurred on matters undertaken or to be undertaken or accomplished or to be accomplished pursuant to the Improvement Ordinance or any authority therein or thereunder.

Section 6. All Federal Funds received or to be received by the Township in aid of financing the improvement or purpose stated in Section 3 of this bond ordinance shall be applied to the payment of the cost of said improvement or purpose or to the extent permitted by law, shall be applied to the payment and retirement of obligations of the Township issued for the purpose described in Section 3 hereof.

Section 7. The full faith and credit of the Township are hereby pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on the said obligations authorized by this bond ordinance. Said Obligations shall be direct, unlimited obligations of the Township, and the Township shall be obligated to levy ad valorem taxes upon all the taxable property within the Township for the payment of said obligations and interest thereon without limitation of rate or amount.

Section 8. This bond ordinance shall take effect twenty (20) days after the first publication thereof after final passage, as provided by said Local Bond Law.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR REGULATIONS GOVERNING THE CONSTRUCTION, ALTERATION, REMOVAL, DEMOLITION, EQUIPMENT, USE OF OCCUPANCY, LOCATION AND MAINTENANCE OF BUILDINGS AND STRUCTURES AND FIRE LIMITS.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson; DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1 The National Building Code as adopted by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen on February 16, 1966 is hereby smended as follows;

(1) Section 103 "Certificates" be amended by adding thereto paragraph 103.8 "Certificates for new construction."

No permit or Certificate of Occupancy shall be issued for the construction of any structure unless said structure shall have frontage on an improved dedicated street having a paved width of not less than 24 feet and a right of way of not less than 40 feet. Said improvement shall include concrete sidewalks of 4 foot minimum width, curbs, sanitary and storm sewers, public water supply and necessary appurtenences. Said street and walk improvements must be continued to existing paved facilities, even though said improvements may continue beyond the limits of a proposed improvement. The township will not install any improvement unless specifically authorized by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen.

- (2) Section 316 "Garages" be amended by adding thereto paragraph 316.6 "Driveway Access".
 - (a) All driveways having access from a street or paved area and serving a garage or other paved area used for parking purposes shall have a slope exceeding 10 feet per 100 feet within the property limits.
 - (b) Headroom in driveways to all garages shall be 7'-0" for cars, 15'-0" for trucks.

(a) Section 404 entitled Side Tards. Rear yards and courts be amended by adding the following worling.

404.1 Rear Yarda

No parking other than garaged parking shell be allowed in a required rear yard area.

404.2 Side Yards (b)

Where an exit door is required, such a door when open shall not obstruct the side yard passage.

404.2 Side Yards (f)

No stairway will be constructed in a side yard where construction of said stairs will be less than 3 feet clear of adjacent building.

(4) Section 925" Titled Drainage and Severage be added as follows:

925.1 General and Severage design Drainage shall conform to mationally recognized good practice on matters not covered by this code

925.2 Surface Vater Pisposal

- a. All atractures hereinsiter constructed or erected shall have roof drainage facilities provided by either roof drains or leaders and gutters, and enid facilities shall be constructed to either a storm sever or the strest gutter. In no case shall roof water than is a street gutter more than 200 feet before entering a catch basin.
- b. Where storm sever or basins are unavailable, a properly designed dry voll filled with coke or cinders may be substituted, provided it has been designed by a licensed Architect or Engineer, and to have been constructed in accordance with the plans filed with the permit.

923.3 Design

a. The national method of drainage design shall be used in calculating the volume of discharge from a given area. The national formula being:-

Q = CIA

where A = rate of discharge in cfs C is the coefficient of runoff, I is the intensity of rainfall in in/hr at the time of concentration and A is the area contributing runoff in acres. The minimum intensity duration curve shall be taken at 2.25 in/hr at 60 minute duration.

925.4 Easements

Any lot having utility (sewage, storm, water, gas etc.) lines of running in through and/or beyond the parcel, shall have a description of said easement filed in this office of the Register of Hudson County prior to obtaining a permit for construction. Said easement shall be continuous and sufficiently wide to allow equipment to operate whenever repairs or reconstruction are required, and in no event will an easement be less than fifteen (15) feet in width nor will the easement be occupied by any building or structure.

925.5 Samitary facilities

- a. Sanitary facilities shall be designed in accordance with the Plumbing and Health Codes of the Township of Worth Bergen.
- b. Each structure requiring sanitary sewerage facilities shall be serviced by a separate sanitary sewer connection leading directly to a main sewer of 8" min diameter with manholec constructed at each end. Where said sever is not maintained by the Township of North Bergen them a description of the method of maintenance and repair shall be filed with the Township Plumbing Inspector for his approval. Individual dwellings located on separately taxed lots shall have separate sanitary sewer connections as outline above.

Section 1. Saving Clause.

Nothing in this ordinance or in the building code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding now pending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, nor any cause or causes of action accrued or exisiting, under any act or ordinance repealed hereby. Nor shall any right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this ordinance.

Section 3. Validity.

The invalidity of any section or provision of this ordinance or of the building code hereby adopted shell not invalidate other sections or provisions thereof.

Section 4. Inconsistent Ordinances Repealed.

Ordinances or parts thereof in force at the time that this ordinance shall take effect and inconsistent herewith, are hereby repealed.

Section 5.

This ordinance shall take effect after adoption and publication as required by law.

Section 8: TRUCK LOADS CAUSING LITTER: No person shall drive vehicle within the Township unless such vehicle is so constructed or load or move any truck or other vehicle within the Township unless such vehicle is so constructed or loaded as to prevent any load, contents or litter from being blown or deposited upon any street, alley or other public place. Nor shall any person drive or move any vehicle or truck within the Township, the wheels or tires of which carry onto or deposit in any street, alley or other public place. An excessive amount of mud, dirt, sticky substances, litter or foreign matter of any kind.

Section 9: LITTER IN PARKS: No person shall throw or deposit litter in any park within the Township except in public receptacles and in such a manner that the litter will be prevented from being carried or deposited by the elements upon any part of the park or upon any street or other public place. Where public receptacles are not provided, all such litter shall be exercised away from the park by the person responsible for its presence and properly disposed of elsewhere as provided herein.

AN ORDINANCE TO VACATE THAT PORTION OF LIBERTY AVENUE FROM THE NORTHERLY LINE OF 47TH STREET TO THE SOUTHERLY LINE OF 49TH STREET IN THE IOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON.

WHEREAS that portion of Liberty Avenue from the northerly line of 47th Street to the southerly line of 4dth Street is unimproved and has a right of way width of 35 feet from the northerly line of 47th Street for a distance of 101.48 feet northerly therefrom and a right of way of 23 feet in width from said point for a distance of 101.78 to the southerly line of 48th Street; and

WHEREAS the lands for said right of way were acquired by the township for the construction of 27" storm and an 8" sanitary sewer and manholes serving 48th Street and flowing toward 47th Street, where said sewers are in operation; and

WHEREAS it is impractical to improve said Liberty Avenue because of the narrowness of the northerly portion of said right of way and limited to that width of the construction of dwellings at the easterly and westerly sides of said right of way; and

WHEREAS the said portion of Liberty Avenue cannot be properly maintained with conditions detremental to the neighborhood, now, therefore.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson and State of New Jersey, as follows: -

Section 1: That Liberty Avenue, extending from the northerly line of 47th Street to the southerly line of 48th Street be, and the same is hereby vacated as a public street and all public easements and public rights to the surface of the same, excepting only the right to operate, maintain, repair, rebuild or enlarge the storm sewer, sanitary sewers, manholes and appurtenances to the same be, and the same are hereby surrendered and extinguished.

Section 2: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances which are In conflict with this ordinance or any part hereof are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

That this ordinance shall take effect when adopted Section 3: and published as required by law.

AN ORDINANCE FIXING, DETERMINING AND REGULATING THE HOURS OF EMPLOYMENT OF THE UNIFORMED PAID MEMBERS OF THE FIRE DEPARTMENT OF THE TOWNSHIP OF NORTH BERGEN IN THE COUNTY OF HUDSON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY.

The Board of Commissioners of the Township of North Bergen in the County of Hudson. DO ORDAIN:

Section 1: A schedule of actual duty is hereby adopted so that each paid member of the North Bergen Fire Department shall be on actual duty for an average of 42 hours per week in any 6-week cycle; provided however that nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to mean that in times of emergency the officer, board or official, having charge or control of the North Bergen Fire Department shall be prohibited from summoning to and keeping on duty as many such firemen as shall be necessary within the sole discretion of such officer, board or official, to cope with such emergency; and provided further that any mamber of said fire department so kept on duty during such emergency shall receive, during the next 12 months thereafter, a number of hours free from actual duty, deducted from such 42 average hours, equal to the number of hours in excess of an average of 42 hours per week in any 8-week cycle in which he bhall have served during such emergency.

Section 2: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances which are in conflict with this ordinance or any part hereof are hereby repealed as to the conflicting portions thereof.

Section 3: That this ordinance shall take effect when adopted and published as required by law.
